## CUBAN SITUATION.

Consul-General Called Upon the President.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20.—General Fitzhugh Lee, consul general to Cuba, had a long consultation with the president at the White House.

General Lee carefully reviewed the situation in Cuba and explained a length all the points upon which the president asked for information. General Lee gave his views very freely to the president, but after the interview was reticent about the nature of the report he had made.

It is evident, however, the president is deeply impressed with the critical character of the situation as described by General Lee, as it is understood he strongly urged Lee to retain his office at least for the present, and to return to Havana at his earliest convenience.

General Lee left here for Covington, Va., but before his departure said he would return to Cuba as soon as he had arranged his private affairs, probably about the middle of October.

## DISTRESS IN IRELAND.

Reports of the Situation On the Emerald Isle.

LONDON, Sept. 20.—(Copyright, 1897, by the Associated Press.)—The extent of the distress threatened Ireland seems to depend largely through which party's eyes it is viewed. The council of the national federation has decided that the country is on the brink of a widespread calamity, and calls upon Messrs. Dillon and Harrington to convoke a meeting of the Irish members of parliament for the purpose of requisitioning Mr. Balfour, the government leader in the commons, to call an autumn session of parliament, to devise relief measures and to pass a bill reducing rents in Ireland in proportion to the loss incurred by the tenants, owing to the wholesale destruction of their crops.

On the other hand, the Dublin Express says the cry of famine is only a continuation of the party war cry which is raised every year that the unionists are in office, and adds:

"Judging from the past, we may hope that much of the crops doomed to destruction by the prophets of evil will be rescued and that the general famine will be much larger than expected."

The Daily Independent regards the suggestion that the Duchess of York will shortly appeal for funds in behalf of the Irish who are threatened with famine as an insult, and says:

"If the country was ten times as badly off as it is likely to be, it would present any charitable appeal to the English."

The Independent emphatically denies that Ireland will suffer acute distress.
