

WASHINGTON, Sept. 20.-General Fitzhugh Lee, consul general to Cuba, had a long consultation with the president at the White House,

General Lee carefully reviewed the situation in Cuba and explained a length all the points upon which the president asked for information. General Lee gave his views very freely to the president, but after the interview was reticent about the nature of the report he had made.

It is evident, however, the president is deeply impressed with the critical character of the situation as described by General Lee, as it is understood he strongly urged Lee to retain his office at least for the present, and to return to Havana at his earllest convenience.

General Lee left here for Covington, Va., but before his departure said he would return to Cuba as soon as he had arranged his private affairs, probably about the middle of October.

LONDON, Sept. 20 .- (Copyright, 1897, by the Associated Press.)—The extent of the distress threatened Ireland to depend largely through which party's eyes it is viewed. Dillon and Harringto convoke a meeting of the Irish members of parliament for the purpose of requisitioning Mr. Balfour, the government leader in the commons, to call an autumn session of parliament, to devise relief measures and to pass a bill reducing rents in Ireland in proportion to the loss incurred by the tenants, owing to the wholesale de-
