

**THE HIGHER GRADE**

For the Public Schools of Salem.

THE OPENING DAY POSTPONED.

A Professor of Physical Culture Is Employed.

At the regular meeting of the Salem public school board held last evening several matters of importance were adopted.

The first matter of importance was the adoption of the following resolution introduced by Mr. Bruce which means the advancement of our schools one grade higher.

"Whereas, Many patrons of the schools in this district desire that an additional grade be added to the course of study, and

"Whereas, It is believed that such grade may be introduced without entailing any considerable expense upon this district for the coming school year, therefore be it

Resolved, By this board that the following branches of study be added to the present course of study, viz: Physical geography, elementary algebra, higher arithmetic and composition and rhetoric, and that the city superintendent is hereby authorized to make all necessary provision for these additional branches in the program of daily recitations and study."

The clerk was instructed to notify parents and guardians of children to appear in person, at the clerk's office, to register their children for admission to the schools, so as to avoid inconvenience. If children come alone, and are unable to answer questions satisfactorily they will not be registered until someone who has authority over them will make satisfactory replies to the questions propounded. This is done for the purpose of protecting the schools from non-resident pupils, as only bona fide resident pupils are entitled to free tuition. The rate of tuition for outsiders will be \$5 per term of 4 months for the primary department, and \$7.50 per term of 4 months for the grammar department.

The following petition signed by about a hundred citizens was adopted:

"SALEM OR., Sept. 18, 1897.  
 "To the Board of School Directors of School District No. 24, Salem Or.:  
 "Whereas the citizens and taxpayers of your district are largely interested in the financial success of the state fair, and in our judgment the best work cannot be done in the school room during the continuance of said fair, owing to the fact that the minds of the children will be diverted from their studies; therefore, and in order to show our appreciation of the efforts of the managers of the fair, we would respectfully petition that opening of the public schools be postponed until after the fair.

This postponement of the opening of the schools one week will also carry with it a postponement of the principal's meeting at the East school, from October 1, to Friday October 8, at 2 p. m. and the teachers' meeting from October 2, to Saturday October 9, at 2 p. m. making these meetings just one week later than had been announced heretofore.

Prof. Frank E. Brown, who is professor of physical culture in Willamette university, was on hand and further presented a proposition to give instructions at the various schools of the city in his work. The board after full consideration decided to employ Mr. Brown at \$25 per month to devote half his time to this department. All the schools will be visited each week, and every child given an opportunity to have the benefit of Prof. Brown's training.

**SOME CORRESPONDENCE.**  
 Between One of the District Fairs and Secretary Kincaid.

Following important correspondence, relating to the finances of the First Southern Oregon District Agricultural society of Medford, is now for the first time made public:  
 President J. C. Pendleton writes, under date of September 15, as follows:  
 As my bond, as President of the First Southern Oregon District Agricultural society has been accepted and filed; please send me your earliest possible evidence on your warrant for the \$900 premium money for this District and The Lake County Agricultural society. I have on file the affidavit of Eldon M. Brittain, county judge of Lake county, setting forth the facts as required in section 10 in the law creating this district.

SECRETARY KINCAID'S REPLY.  
 Following is the full text of the reply of Hon. H. R. Kincaid, secretary of state, under date of September 17, 1897:

Your letter of September 15 has been received in which you apply for a warrant for the \$900 premium money for your district fair and for the Lake County Agricultural society. On examining the statutes I find that the act filed in the office of the secretary of state February 21, 1893, provides as follows:

"Section 9. To carry out the provisions of this act, there is hereby appropriated annually out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$900 to the president of the First Southern Oregon District Agricultural society, and the sum of \$900 to the president of the Second Southern Oregon District Agricultural society, who shall, before receiving the same, give a bond in double the amount appropriated to their respective societies to the secretary of state, to be approved by the governor and said secretary, conditioned that said money shall only be used in the payment of premiums awarded by the Southern Oregon district Agricultural societies, and for no other purpose; provided, that should either of said boards fail in any year to offer and award premiums for agricultural and other industrial pursuits equal to the amounts hereby appropriated, then the benefit of this section shall not be available that year to the society failing; and it is further provided, that no part of the money herein appropriated shall be offered or paid as a premium for trials of speed."

An act approved February 20, 1889, creates the First Eastern Oregon District Agricultural society and the Second Eastern Oregon District Agricultural society. This act provides as follows:

"Section 9. To carry out the provisions of this act there is hereby appropriated, annually, out of any money in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1500 to the president of each Eastern Oregon District Board of Agriculture, who shall, before receiving the same, give a bond in double the amount to the secretary of state, to be approved by the governor and said secretary, conditioned that said money shall only be used in the payment of premiums awarded by the Eastern Oregon District Boards of Agriculture, and for no other purpose; provided, that should either of said boards fail in any year to offer and award premiums for agricultural and other industrial pursuits equal to the amount hereby appropriated, then the benefit of this act shall not be available heretofore.

that year to the society failing; and it is further provided that no part of the money herein appropriated shall be offered or paid as a premium for trials of speed."

An act approved February 20, 1885 creates the State Agricultural society. This act provides as follows, Hill's code, page 1405, session laws, 1885, page 59:

"Sec. 13. To carry out the provisions of this act, there is hereby appropriated annually out of any money in the treasury applicable, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$5,000, payable to the president of the state board of agriculture, who shall, before receiving the same, give a bond in double the amount, to the secretary of state to be approved by the governor and said secretary, conditioned that said money shall only be used in the payment of premiums awarded by the state board of agriculture and for no other purpose, provided, that should said board fail in any year to offer and award premiums for agriculture and other industrial pursuits equal to the amount hereby appropriated, then the benefit of this section shall not be available that year; and it is further provided that no part of the money herein appropriated shall be offered or paid as a premium for trials of speed."

The appropriations for each of these agricultural societies have been inserted biennially ever since the acts creating these societies became laws in every bill to provide for the ordinary expenses of the state government and general and specific appropriations. However, it seems to me that these several acts were intended to appropriate and do appropriate the money to carry them out annually without any further legislation. Until the acts shall be repealed the money is due, when the societies comply with the provisions of the law, as they are now required to do. Nothing could be saved to the state by withholding it, as it could be collected by judicial proceedings, while the societies would be greatly inconvenienced and injured by withholding their money. For these reasons, I shall issue warrants to each of the societies above named, as fast as they comply with the law and subscribe to the oath herewith enclosed obligating themselves to disburse the money according to law.
