A Crisis. New York, Nov. 12.—A dispatch to the Herald from Panama says: The political situation in Columbia is critical. Fears are expressed in official circles that the conservatives are conspiring against the government, and these expressions have aroused uneasiness.

Advices just received from Bogota state that Vice-President Caro has had a conference with General Reyes, candidate for president, and Dr. Aquilino Pera, the leaders of the conservatives and liberal parties. The vice-president declared that in his opinion the only practical solution of the political problem was to respect every citizen's vote in the coming election.

The conservatives are alarmed at this stand, which, if adopted, would inevitably bring the liberal party legally to power. This has caused the conservatives to openly declare against the government and plotting is feared.
