Silver Men of All Parties Will Unite.

Silver Republicans and Democrats Call Conventions.

A meeting of the Silver-Republican state central committee was held Saturday at Portland, for the purpose of appointing the number of delegates to the next state convention. Nineteen of the 32 counties of the state were represented at the meeting, as follows:

The basis of representation to the state convention was fixed at two at large from each county, and one for every 700 votes, and major fraction thereof, cast for the People's, Democratic, Silver Republican presidential electors in November, 1896. On such convention there will be 131 delegates to the convention, as follows:

An executive committee of five was appointed as follows: W. T. Rigdon, Marion county; W. Hampton Smith, Clatsop; Seneca Smith, Multnomah; C. M. Donaldson, Baker; C. W. Talmage, Yamhill, and a resolution was adopted notifying the Democratic State Central Committee of the same.

The resolution in reference to the alliance of the silver forces with the union conference met with a hearty sympathy and approval of the state committee.

At a session of the executive committee held after adjournment of the state committee, it was resolved that the state convention of the Silver Republican party be called to meet in Portland for March 23.

THE DEMOCRATS.

The Democratic State Committee held a similar meeting and fixed the same date, March 23, for their state convention. Its representation will be much larger, being one delegate for each 200 Bryan voters.

UNION MOVEMENT.

The result of the conference of silver forces which was held in Portland Friday, at the call of Chairman Cooper, of the union party, is seen in the following resolutions, which were passed unanimously just before adjournment:

We recognize that the general welfare of our country is opposed by the common enemy that should be met by a solid phalanx of American citizens, who love their country and desire the greatest good to the greatest number. We therefore recommend that this meeting request the people of the Populist party, the Democratic party and the Silver-Republican party to use all fair and honorable means to secure a proper alliance of these parties in district, state and county organizations, to the end that co-operation may be had at the coming election.

There are plenty of good men in any or all of these parties, pure in principle and tried in patriotism, to fill with honor to their constituents the trusts to which the people would call their servants by popular vote.

Therefore we would hope:

First—That the conventions of the several parties be held at the same time and place.

Second—That they endeavor to agree upon the same principles and candidates, maintaining their separate party organizations.

Third—That the county organizations endeavor to govern themselves by the same co-operation similar to that of the district and state organizations.

Fourth—That all work together for such a victory as is sure to follow harmony of action for a just cause, for in union there is strength. (Signed) W. R. King, H. L. Heath, C. L. Moore, J. G. Stevenson, Del. Stuart, committee.

POPULISTS.

The Umatilla county Populist committee met at Pendleton last Saturday, and passed the following resolution:

"Resolved, That the People's party of Umatilla county, with a view to the promotion of the cause of good government, hereby declares itself in favor of a co-operation of all reform forces in the approaching state and county campaign. To the furtherance of this end, the People's party of Umatilla county hereby extends a cordial invitation to any party or organization, desiring a communication of the object above set forth, to appoint and clothe with proper authority a committee of five to confer with a similar committee of this party and arrange details of such co-operation. They also asked for a platform of direct legislation, free coinage, income tax, and government economy."

FOREIGN NEWS NOTES.

Berlin dispatches announce that Germany is anxious for a reciprocity treaty with the United States.

The wheat crop in the northern district of Australia is estimated to be between 14 and 15 bushels per acre.

A St. Petersburg dispatch announces that the czar and czarina will receive their friends at the Paris exposition of 1900 in their own pavilion which will cost £200,000.

George L. Watson, says a London dispatch, has finished the design of a very large steam yacht for James Gordon Bennett, proprietor of the New York Herald, which will probably be built on the Clyde.

Advices from Mexico are that Mexico will settle the claim of this government for the death of Michael Green, an Ohio citizen, who was imprisoned and sentenced without trial and died from hard labor and exposure. Full reparation will be made.

A London Cable announces a scandal is agitating the Italian aristocracy. The celebrated duca house of Littau, Viscount Arex has renounced its Italian nationality. The duke married Countess Ross Tarsis, a noted beauty by whom he had two daughters, and some time afterward a boy. The duke repudiated the boy's paternity and accuses a very high person. He has established the fact in the course that the child is not his; but as divorce does not exist in Italy, the duke has become a French citizen, and has instituted proceedings.

STATE NEWS.

The new mill at Vale, Malheur county, will be ready for work on the 15th of January.

Nathan Bradley, of Dayton, died suddenly at his home Friday evening. He fell dead while wiping his hands and face. Paralysis was the cause.

R. N. Whitehead has extended the time of the loan of the \$10,000 he has against the Medford school district, in Jackson county. The district is to pay him 7 per cent interest in the future.

J. R. Douglas, of Albany, took the first prize, and J. Beck, of Newberg, the third prize offered by an Eastern firm for the best onions raised in the United States or Canada. Thus Oregon won two prizes against the whole of North America, and Linn county won the first. Mr. Douglas has taken in prizes during the past year \$138.50 on his garden produce.
