THIRD OF A BILLION.

Remarkable Story of a Clerk in a Lewiston House.

His Forefathers Were Granted Acres in Gotham's Business Center.

LEWISTON, Ida., Special: Several days ago the brief announcement was made that J. M. Edwards, a clothing salesman of Lewiston, had received authentic information that after years of investigation he has come into a fortune amounting to nearly \$1,000,000. The tract of land is in the business heart of the city of New York.

"The tract embraces 45 acres extending from Battery street to Canal street and includes all of the promontory which extends from Canal street out into the bay. The great business blocks on Wall street and on Broadway, the government building, postoffice, custom houses and mint are on this property.

"This land was leased to King George III, by the Edwards family for colonial use prior to the revolutionary war for a period of 99 years. It was afterwards subject by a crown lease to a Dutch settler and later sold out into city lots subject to the terms of the lease. Thus the Edwards ownership was recognized prior to the revolutionary war. Later deeds were absolute, but the Edwards heirs never lost sight of their equity and when the lease expired efforts were made to establish title, but many reverses followed.

"Accusations of forgery and bribery were made in connection with the claim until 12 years ago, when one of the heirs fitted himself for the contest and began the work of establishing title for the heirs of Robert Edwards.

"This man finally perfected an abstract of title from the crown grant in the first instances and then the lease to the crown for the use of the colony, then the subtle lease to the individual who sold off lots subject to the lease. It seems that all the rights of the Edwards heirs were protected to avoid lapse of title by prescription under the common law.

"The copies of deeds and leases form perhaps the most complete abstract of title in the civilized world. This work was compiled by William Edwards of Tennessee in 1876. He took the case out of the hands of the lawyers 12 years ago. For ten years he worked incessantly on the task, spending a private fortune in the work, but when he confronted the attorneys of the present holders of the property in 1890 they advised a compromise.

"Mr. Edwards was required to secure identification through the secretary of state of the national government before he could secure the evidence of title he required from the archives of the English government.

"Mr. Edwards had secured about 200 powers of attorneys from the living heirs of Robert Edwards. When he came to New York with his evidence and a compromise was proposed he entered into an undertaking to quiet title for the sum of \$305,000,000.

"Over \$1,000,000 of this sum was placed on deposit and the date fixed for the distribution was September 9, 1896.

"The heirs were quietly summoned to New York to transfer title and to secure for each a share of over a million dollars.

"But some of the heirs who were possessed of large fortunes refused to compromise for what they considered a small portion of the great estate. William Edwards, who had all but finished the great work of his life, was insulted and grieved by the ungrateful attitude of these heirs and by the imputation that he had exceeded his authority. He dropped the great work then and there.

"The title to the realty, however, was established and the holders applied to the courts for an order to quiet title. A suit was brought to compel the heirs of Robert Edwards to make a deed in accordance with the contract entered into by their attorneys-in-fact by which the heirs were to receive \$305,000,000. This contract is now held to be binding upon the heirs and the compromise price of \$305,000,000 is ready for distribution.

J. M. Edwards is not informed as to the exact number 300. His father's family consisted of 19 children, full and half brothers and sisters. Some of these are dead. Two sisters live near Spokane, Mrs. J. S. Marney and Mrs. Emmett Robinson. The brother, James J. Edwards, is with the Sterling Mercantile Company in Walla Walla. The family home is in Tennessee, where the mother owns a homestead of 4800 acres of land. The father died several years ago.

J. M. Edwards has been in the employ of J. P. Volmer, but has been monthly for eight years, but he has lived in Genesee the greater part of the time. He has a family of wife and two children, and is working as a salesman while waiting final summons to take possession of his million.

CIRCUIT COURT.

In the circuit court in the suit of W. E. Mitchell, plaintiff, vs. the Oregon Woman's Flax & Hemp Fibre association, defendants, Bonham, Jeffrey & Martin, attorneys for the defense, filed a demurrer to the complaint. The property attached, belonging to the defendant corporation, consists of 135 bales of fax tow, 190 sacks of flax seed and 50 sacks of oats.
