GREAT FIGHT OVER TEXT BOOKS IN OREGON.

There was a hard fight in Oregon last spring over the office of State Superintendent of Schools. It was foreordained by the educational "powers" within the Republican party that State Superintendent Irwin must go. He could not be relied on by the school book trust politicians, They had fought him when he was a candidate and confidently expected his defeat. But his Methodist friends, his Grand Army friends and his abil. ity to make stump speeches put him in office with lots of votes to spare. But it would never do to renominate him, in the eyes of the High Lords of the School Trust. He could not be relied upon to appoint a State Board of Examiners who would all vote and hustle for the trust. He said so before the state convention and said furthermore that there should be text book legislation, as Oregon public school books were costing a great deal more money than in other states. where they used the same books. 
