## FIXES RESPONSIBILITY

The Daily Bill for the Selection of Public School Text Books.

Would Let the People Know Who Made Them Pay More Than Idaho.

Corvallis Times.

No person familiar with all the conditions will deny that there is vital need of a change in the Oregon school law. That there are books now in use in the schools notorious with faults and error is everywhere conceded. That even for these faulty books Oregon pays from ten to thirty percent more than does Washington or Idaho is an absolute fact, known by all who have taken the trouble to inquire into the matter. In short, bad books at absurdly high prices is an admitted condition, and it is the creation of the law that is now in force. The question is, shall we retain the present arrangement, or shall we try another plan which cannot possibly do worse for us, and which may do a great deal better.

The Daily bill proposes a commission of five, to be appointed by the governor, for the selection of school books. To the governor and to each member of this commission there will be the highest incentive to reduce the price of Oregon school books. Such a reduction would reach the attention and secure the welcome approval of every school book buyer in Oregon, which means that almost every home in Oregon would yield hearty gratitude to the governor of the state and the members of the commission. No influence could be more powerful in leading to resistance of corruption and an honest discharge of duty. Every official act of the commission and every vote for books and prices for books is to be a matter of public record, to be known by every citizen of the state. Failure to correct prevailing abuses would bring both the governor and the members of the commission into disrepute. The present arrangement suffers those who fixed present books and prices perfect freedom from responsibility. No man knows now what men they were who plumed school patrons of Oregon into necessity of paying from ten to thirty percent more for books than is paid in Idaho. With the commission, responsibility cannot be escaped. A continuation of the prices and conditions that now exist would destroy the political hopes and public reputation of the governor and of each individual member of the commission.

**Norway Buying Guns.**  
By Associated Press to the Journal. CHRISTIANIA, Jan. 13.—The evening papers report that Mr. T. A. Darling, president of the company, which erected the battery of 15-inch dynamite guns at Sandy Hook, and who has arrived in London, will within the next few days visit at Christiania.

It is believed that Mr. Darling's visit is at the special invitation of the leaders of the Norwegian radicals, who are anxious to be prepared for an expected coercive movement on the part of Sweden.  
During the prolonged controversies last year between Norway and Sweden as to the constitutional rights of Norway—the right to special consular representation, the adoption of an independent flag, etc.—it is said that the Norwegian radicals secretly alienated the Norwegian army and navy officers from Sweden, and that of late war preparations have been made, so that Norway is prepared for any emergency.

In case of a war with Sweden, the equipment of the principal ports with dynamite guns such as are now stationed at Sandy Hook would make Norway indomitable from the sea. The land forces would prove a redoubtable foe to the Swedish army. The majority of the Norwegians are heartily tired of their union with Sweden, and the sanguine predict that Norway will be independent before the close of the century.

**Swindle Tourists.**  
By Associated Press to the Journal. LONDON, Jan. 12.—A few young swindle tricksters have been reaping a rich harvest from American and English lady visitors in Rome by means of a new variation of the confidence trick.

The trickster selects a likely victim in an omnibus, introduces himself by means of some small act of politeness, chat in perfect English, displaying an intimate acquaintance in the pope's household. When the lady shows deep interest he says he is a member of the pope's noble body guard, and could manage to let her see his holiness if she wishes.

The delighted lady is generally anxious. Then the pseudo count casually remarks that 10 or 12 lire is necessary to tip the chapel janitor. The victim produces this, gives her address and goes her way rejoicing, but never again sees the fascinating nobleman. There have been crowds of victims lately.

**Should Unite.**  
By Associated Press to the Journal. VANOUVER, B. C., Jan. 13.—Japanese papers to hand by the Empress of Japan are full of interviews with Hon. John Barrett, recently United States minister to Siam, on the Chinese question.

Mr. Barrett thinks that the time is ripe for the adoption of an active far eastern policy by England, Japan and the United States, which is possible, the co-operation of Germany.  
Russia and France, whose policy appears to be to gain gradually the exclusive control of vast areas of Chinese territory, and to close these areas to unrestricted trade, would thus be confronted by a pressure impossible to resist, and would find themselves compelled to guarantee within their "spheres of influence" the maintenance of equal trade rights conferred by existing treaties between China and foreign powers.

**Daring Robbery.**  
By Associated Press to the Journal. CHICAGO, Jan. 13.—Rev. P. A. Hardin, presiding elder of the Chicago district of the Rock River church, was overpowered and robbed in a Chicago & Eastern Illinois train between Dearborn-street station and sixteenth street. The car was filled with passengers, but the sudden attack of the four robbers on the aged man seemed to paralyze them with astonishment and fear.

The minister shouted that he was being robbed, but no one came to the rescue. The men secured his wallet containing \$40, railroad tickets and other papers, and jumped off the rapidly moving train.

Rev. Hardin is over 70 years old, and he has been connected with the Methodist church in Northern Illinois for many years. No trace of the robbers has been secured.
