VIRTUE IS REWARDED

By Retaining His Clerk in Spite of Chairman Brattain.

A Republican House Unflinchingly Stands by a Democrat Who Wants a Clerk.

The matter of Virtue's clerk came up again, when Brattain recalled from the committee on resolutions his resolution No. 16. This was a resolution to rescind the mistaken action by which an unnecessary clerk had been granted to the committee on Mines, of which Brattain was chairman, and which had no business before it and no use for clerk. Brattain moved the adoption of his resolution, but was headed off by Moody, who moved that action be postponed until Virtue, at whose request the clerk had been granted and who claimed to need her services, should be present. This was carried unanimously, it appearing that Virtue was not present among the members of the house.

If Brattain succeeds in ridding his committee of that clerk before the end of the session, he will have to get up early in the morning, for the sentiment of the house seems to be decidedly against him.

Thus do the high resolves with which the House attacked the clerkship abuse wither and fall by the wayside.

A joint memorial to the national House of Representatives, introduced by McCulloch, was adopted, protesting against the seating of Brigham H. Roberts, the polygamist gentleman from Utah. Senate bill 153, amending charter of Grants Pass, was passed. The rest of the afternoon was consumed in the first reading of bills bringing the number up to 324.

H. B. 294, Grace, relating to goats running at large.

H. B. 295, Whitney, to regulate the purchase and sale of goods, wares and merchandise in bulk.

H. B. 296, Hill (by request), to authorize and require the various municipalities and towns of the state to establish a free library within such respective cities and towns, to defray the expenses thereof and to maintain the same.

H. B. 297, Curtis, to amend the laws for the protection of salmon.

H. B. 298, Carter, to authorize corporations to extend their boundary lines.

H. B. 299, Roberts, to prevent swine running at large.

H. B. 300, Curtis, to appropriate \$750 for benefit of J. C. Moreland.

H. B. 301, Curtis, to appropriate \$732.23 for the benefit of Sanborn, Vail and Company.

H. B. 302, Curtis, to appropriate \$4000 for the benefit of S. A. Dawson and J. W. Maxwell.

H. B. 303, Curtis, To appropriate the sum of \$364.12 for the benefit of Dales, Portland and Astoria Navigation Company.

H. B. 304, Curtis, To appropriate \$3,000.00 for the benefit of John H. Hill.

H. B. 305, Curtis, To appropriate \$10,000.00 for the benefit of Capt. John Mullen.

H. B. 306, Briggs (by request), To provide for the stay of execution.
