

A DIVORCE CASE.

W. E. Loughmiller Sues for What Ida Could Not Get.

Before Judge Bose at Chambers, at 4 o'clock today, in the equity department of the circuit court, was begun the hearing of the divorce suit of Wm. E. Loughmiller, of Silverton, vs. Ida M. Loughmiller, several years since Mrs. Loughmiller sued for divorce. It was appealed to the supreme court, and is still pending, Mrs. Loughmiller being the only woman who ever failed to get a decree in Judge Hewitt's court. The petition alleges willful desertion on July 12, 1896, and they have not lived together since. Wm. H. Holmes is for plaintiff and Geo. G. Bingham for defense.

Adjournment Friday Night May Not Be Possible.

Tuesday Will Be Devoted to Oregon's Semi-Centennial.

Both houses of the legislature met at 2:30 p. m.

Absolute quiet has prevailed about the legislative halls and state house lobby since noon Saturday. Most of the members spent the time at their homes and not a few went to Portland.

In the House this afternoon the Daily text-book bill was under consideration as a special order, and is the burning question of the session. An immense audience of spectators filled the lobbies. In the Senate there is a vast amount of good work being done. The Judiciary and other important committees have considered scores of bills, which will be ground through as rapidly as possible.

Ex-Sec. Treasurer Metschan is urging several important bills for the relief of the treasury, among them one to convert the insurance tax into the general fund. President Taylor says that the legislature should not adjourn without acting on these bills.

While Friday night has been informally set for adjournment of the legislature, it is not likely that the work of the session will be completed before Saturday night, and possibly Sunday or Monday.

Tuesday, Feb. 14 is set for the celebration of the historical events connected with the 40th and 50th anniversaries of the state and territory.

The programs for forenoon and afternoon will absorb the day, and while the time is very valuable so near the close of the session, the importance of suitably recognizing the achievements of the pioneers that gave Oregon to the nation cannot be over-estimated. There will be a joint session at night when the state dairy and food commissioner and state librarian will be chosen.

The Portland tax collector bill came up for reconsideration in the house this afternoon, the vote was 22 for and 18 against. The bill will come up again this afternoon.

FOR A POOR FARM.

A County Farm Planned and Proposal to Cut Doctor Bills.

County Judge Terrell is in favor of selling the present poor farm near Salem, of about 35 acres, and buying a piece of land in place of it at of at least 500 acres for a county poor farm. Judge Terrell says the present farm is not large enough to raise hay or to keep any stock, or employ paupers in any profitable manner.

The bills for medical attendance all over the country are running up to from \$300 to \$600 a month and thus he thinks could be reduced to a minimum if they had a poor farm to which they could order all applicants for relief. The county would be divided into a few districts and the medical attendance and furnishing of medicine let to the lowest bidder.

In other states this has reduced expense of pauper medical practice to the lowest limit. The pauper medical bills and drug bills some months now exceed what it costs to feed and clothe the poor who get help from the county. Judge Terrell's plan of a county poor farm and letting the doctoring to the lowest bidder deserves attention.
