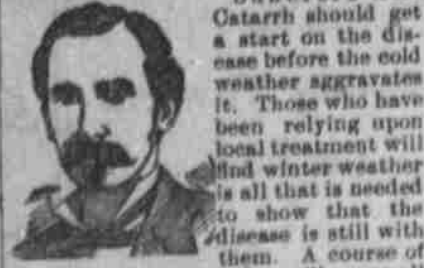

THE VICTORY OF THE DAILY TEXT BOOK BILL.

Many people are surprised that a measure, so universally conceded to be needed in Oregon, as the Daily text-book reform bill, should only finally pass by a small majority and after a hard fight in its favor.

The people should remember that there is no one paid a dollar to advocate this reform. There was no corruption fund used at Salem for the Daily bill. We would risk all our hope of a future here or hereafter on this statement. We do not even charge from any knowledge of ours that the American Book Co. or any company, used a corruption fund at Salem to defeat this. The point we wish to impress on the reader is that while there were profits amounting from \$50,000 to \$75,000 annually to the American Book Co. in keeping the law as it was, there was only the general benefit accruing from cheaper and better text-books in favor of the measure.

So, considering the fact that there was a large moneyed interest against the bill, and only the general welfare of the public schools in favor of it, the Daily bill scored a great victory. The members who spoke for it and voted for it, deserve public thanks and ought to be held in grateful memory by the people.

The JOURNAL tried to treat the opposition to the Daily bill fairly, while never for a moment allowing them to escape the full responsibility for what they were doing, or attempting to do, in defeating the measure. This ground some of them pretty hard, but was perfectly legitimate.
