GRAND JURY

Returns Seven Indictment in the Marion County Ballot Cases.

Defendants Arraigned at One O'clock and Trials Will Be Had at This Term of Court.

The grand jury returned three true bills Thursday evening in the form of joint indictments against P. H. D'Arcy, W. J. D'Arcy, S. T. Richardson, J. A. Carson, W. J. Rafter, H. T. Hayes and L. V. Ehlen, charging them with forgery of public records in altering the tally sheets of the June election in Monitor, Mt. Angel and Butteville precincts, and Marion county. Defendants appeared before Justice Johnson and gave required bail for their appearance.

Defendants all appeared in court this morning at nine o'clock with counsel as follows:

Gen. G. Bingham and John M. Gearin for P. H. D'Arcy, W. J. D'Arcy, J. A. Carson, W. J. Rafter and H. T. Hayes.

M. E. Pogue for L. V. Ehlen.

Judge Bennett of The Dalles for S. T. Richardson.

As Mr. Richardson desired to communicate with his counsel by telephone at The Dalles, the time for arraignment was set for 1 o'clock by District Attorney Hayden. Defendants will stand separate trials in the order demanded by the state.

The cases will be pushed to trial at this term of court without any delay whatever.

The ballot cases are entered as three separate cases in the circuit court docket. Clerk Hall and Deputy Miss McCulloch worked until after midnight last night preparing 21 copies of the indictment, three against each of the seven defendants.

THE ARRAIGNMENT.

S. L. Richardson stated he had employed counsel but wanted time to confer but this was denied. Other defendants appeared by their counsel as above, and Mr. Richardson then stated that he would appear for himself. Bingham asked until Monday to plead in reply to the court's question, guilty or not guilty, but the court ruled the defendants should all plead Saturday at nine o'clock. Mr. Richardson again took exception to the ruling of the court. Judge Burnett replied that he had offered to appoint counsel for him from among the lawyers present.

The district attorney read them several indictments and the same ruling was had on all of them.

THE SUGAR BEET BABY.

Not Much Hope for An Appropriation for This Agricultural Orphan.

A legislative correspondent of the Portland Times says:

Turner Oliver is weakening on the sugar beet graft, or, to be more correct, the senators are weakening. As stated several days ago, the sugar baby sees no possibility of winning the \$200,000 bounty, and is very anxious now to compromise on \$100,000. Even this sum is too high to suit the senators, and the sugar-beet men of LaGrande, who are principally wealthy Mormons, may be thankful if they succeeded in flimflaming the state for \$50,000 at less. The chances are not a red cent will be appropriated to these mendicants despite all the incessant lobbying which has been going on since the commencement of the session.

The scheme of the sugar men to boom their town lots by having county seat of Union changed to LaGrande is also receiving some hard knocks. A delegation of citizens from Union county are here to counteract and undermine the plots and plans of the sugar men, and each crowd watches the other.

[The indications are that there will be an effort to stampee the senate for the sugar bounty at the last moment. Let the members be on their guard.] Ed. J.
