Salem is going into a cash basis. The tide is turning from running behind at \$10,000 a year to a more even balance sheet.

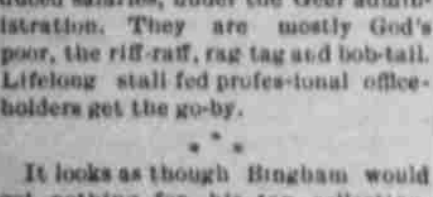
Salem contractors are erecting nearly all the public buildings in Oregon. Salem men are winning a reputation for good honest work at fair prices.

THE SHEEP INDUSTRY.

Suggestions On Increasing the Flocks In "Farm, Stock and Home."

Sheep population—Though the price of sheep and wool for the past year or more was well calculated to stimulate production, yet as a matter of fact the increase in the number of sheep during 1898 was very slight, only about 1,500,000 which is surprising when it is considered how rapidly sheep may multiply and how quickly they mature. And the two-fold named still leaves a pitifully small number of sheep in the country or 39,114,453, but a little over half as many sheep as we have people, or about one sheep to 48 acres of land. On an average. There is no other agricultural country with so few sheep relatively as the United States, and there is none that is better adapted in every way to the successful growing of sheep. When the usefulness of sheep on cultivated lands is remembered the indifference to sheep by the farmers of the country is not only to be regretted but is difficult to understand. It is hoped that the coming year will show a great increase in our sheep population.

The Reason Sheep Increase Slowly.

One reason why sheep increase in number so slowly is because the consumption of mutton is rapidly enlarging. Of late years more attention has been given to the production of mutton, its quality has been greatly improved which has stimulated the appetite for this healthful meat, and has also revealed the fact that mutton can be as cheaply produced, pound for pound, as any other kind of meat, and it nearly always brings a better price. The improvement of mutton is still going on, and this is increasing the appetite for mutton, which is resulting in its larger consumption and will inevitably make the increase of our flocks less rapid than formerly.

The Time for Increasing.

This is the time when much can be done towards increasing the flock, by paying close attention to the prospective mothers of the new recruits, and to the recruits themselves when they arrive. There is now reason to fear that the present spring will be a trying one for young lambs, particularly in the north, for indications point toward a cold lambing season. Where fairly warm sheds are provided they will make but little difference, providing the ewes that are about to lamb are properly housed therein when their offspring arrive. But in the absence of warm sheds the life of many little ones will be saved if the date of their arrival is approximately known, and if the mothers are separated from the rest of the flock and put into comfortable, well ventilated shelter of some kind. Of course the percentage of lost lambs will be much reduced if the ewes have been kept in good condition during the winter and are now strong, thrifty and not overfat.

Watchfulness Pays.

In the absence of comfortable leaning prices the more care must be exercised by the flockmaster. Of course, if the weather is cold some shelter must be provided, if nothing more than what can be improvised around a strawstack. But under any conditions a watchful eye and a sympathetic heart must be over and with the flock at this season. There will be weaklings that will make good sheep a few hours' attention be given to them at birth, but that will die without it. Artificial heat, provided by some old wrap or stove, may be necessary in some cases; a little warm milk in others, and sometimes a little stimulant given internally saves a lamb's life. There may be unsound lambs, that must be introduced to unnatural mothers, in short, there are many things likely to happen that if met promptly will make a great difference in the flock's percentage of gain during the lambing season. A warm bath, a bit of whiskey in sweetened water with warmth to follow often measure the difference between life and death.

Rejected Lambs.

If a ewe rejects its offspring she should be confined in a small pen where she cannot get away from her child, be kindly and gently treated, and her lamb held up to her udder until it takes a few sucks of milk, after which it will generally induce mother to give it more, and she seems more inclined to give it after a start has been made. When twins are dropped there is often more difficulty, since the mother may accept one and reject the other, in which case it is more difficult to get the mother to acknowledge the outcast. Hence it is always well to have access to fresh ewe's milk that may be given, while warm, by means of a nursing bottle and thus a life be saved. If the ewe is weak or her milk deficient, some warm oatmeal gruel will be very beneficial, and during her nursing period she needs to be fed some succulent foods, providing the pasture are not in condition to furnish such food. The ewe has been fed and cared for during the whole winter, and now she is disposed to pay well for her keep, but she may not be able to it if she does not receive the co-operation of her master.
