Officers Cannot Have Claims.

OTTAWA, Ont., April 8.—An order in council has been passed preventing any person employed by the government in any capacity from staking out or recording mining claims on Dominion lands of any kind in the Yukon country. It was also decided to exempt from the realty tax the gross output of any mine up to the amount of \$5000.

An interesting rule for determining the probability of life is stated by M. Schoelling, of Brussels, a French mathematician, who removed to England in 1865. It is simply necessary to subtract one's age from 86 and to divide the remainder by 2, the result being the number of years one is likely to live. The chance of living one year beyond one's present age is found by M. Schoelling to be 5 to 1 at birth, 119 to 1 at 5 years, 512 to 1 at 10 years, 347 to 1 at 15 years, 207 to 1 at 20 years, 120 to 1 at 30 years, and 78 to 1 at 40. Of 1,000 persons of 60 years, 599 will live to 70 years, 120 to 80, and 17 to 90.
