### CORN FOR THE DAIRY.

By Prof. T. L. Haecker in the Minneapolis Farm, Stock and Home.

In the last number was discussed briefly the feeding value of ordinary farm crops. It was shown that fodder corn sown so thickly in drills that no ears formed, and harvested before frost, has a feeding value of \$14 per acre, and that if planted in hills the feeding value of the husked corn and cobs together is only \$8.61. This is not an estimate, but is based upon results obtained from several years of earful experimental work. We plant corn in hills simply because our fathers and grandfathers did. But conditions have changed, knowledge has increased and our methods should change accordingly, and not be content to do more work and get less feeding value from a crop because our fathers did.

### Preparing the Soil.

Since readers know the conditions best suited to a good crop of corn in their respective localities it is not deemed best to prescribe any particular method, for conditions that are favorable to a good crop of ear corn are equally applicable to a good crop of fodder corn. But if there would be any advantage in plowing the ground later than would be done ordinarily, because hill corn is planted in May, late plowing should be practiced. But enough time should be allowed between plowing and planting to permit the burrowing of the field two or three times at weekly intervals. If these methods nearly all the weeds near the surface will germinate and be destroyed.

### Time to Plant.

We have planted from the 15th of May to the 25th of June, and in a few instances as late as the first part of July.

### Winter Rye.

Winter rye provides the earliest feed in the spring and should be sown in September so it will make a good growth before the ground freezes. It will be ready for the stock in the spring as soon as the soil gets firm, and can be pastured for a fortnight without materially injuring the crop.

### How to Plant.

Various methods have been tried, such as making a furrow with a common plow and sowing by hand, sowing with a single horse drill, broadcast, and sowing with a wheat drill, and with a shoe drill.

### Cultivating.

The field should be harrowed once before the corn is up and at least once after it rises to the ground. If weeds make their appearance it may be cultivated between the rows as often as may require.

### Silage.
