GOLD EXPORTS.

One Million Dollars to Be Shipped to Europe.

By Associated Press to the Journal. NEW YORK, June 3.—The Journal and Advertiser says: The announcement that the National City bank would ship \$1,000,000 in gold to Europe on the steamship Locomia was considerable of a surprise in Wall street. Although sterling exchange has ruled rather high, there was little likelihood of any gold exports at the present time.

That shipment should be made by the National City bank, which engineered the payment of the Spanish indemnity of \$20,000,000 without sending gold abroad up to the present time kills to some extent the force of any arguments which may be based on the shipment.

The view taken of the shipment by conservative men is that the United States is producing \$60,000,000 gold annually and now has on hand more of the precious metal than any other country, and therefore can easily afford to send several millions to Europe. Beside the demand for exchange to offset the payment of the Spanish indemnity, there has been a fair increase in the imports of finished goods from Europe which must be paid for. This season of the year is, furthermore, the period when large sums are taken abroad by tourists.

The exports of food products also decline in the spring but this year are very largely offset by exports of American manufactured goods. Europe has been buying back large quantities of our stocks which were sold here some months ago, but has been steadily selling bonds.

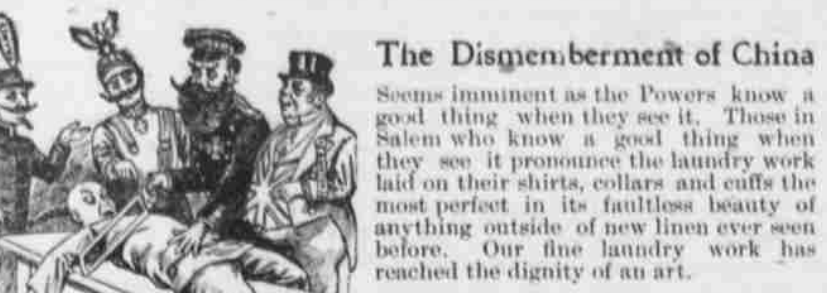
