ELECTRIC FIRE ESCAPE

Oregon Insane Asylum to Be Equipped With the First on the Coast.

Inmates Will Simply Jump in and Let Go and Be Swiftly and Gently Lowered to Terra Firma.

Inmates of the Oregon insane asylum at Salem soon will be practically guaranteed against death by fire in that institution. Also the asylum will have the distinction of being equipped with a new variety of fire escape, the like of which has never before been seen on the Pacific coast.

The Northwest Electric Engineering Company, of Portland, has secured a contract for installing at the asylum a Kierker-Bender fire escape, and will commence the work in the near future. This apparatus is a wonder. It consists of a cylindrical shaft six feet in diameter, set up outside of the building, with openings to every floor. Inside is a spiral chute or slide. All that is necessary for a person wishing to escape from a burning building to do is to open the door to this fire escape, sit down on the slide and let go. The slide is so constructed that it controls the speed of the body descending, the speed being no greater at the bottom than at the beginning of the descent. This has been practically and publicly demonstrated at various places in the East where these escapes are in use. Fully 200,000 trips have been made through them and no one has been the least hurt, nor is there any possible chance for any one to ever get injured.

The entrance doors have projecting frames so that they can open inward and not interfere with the slide. These doors close automatically to prevent the entrance of smoke and heat. The exit doors open outward. A very light pressure of any object sliding against it opens an automatic latch on these doors. The slide comes within 18 inches of the ground. Escaping persons get up as if arising from a chair on reaching the exit.

Escaping from a burning building by means of this device will be a pleasure. It will be like enjoying a toboggan slide.

Inmates of buildings can slide gently to the ground instead of clinging wildly in midair to the old-style ladder, and being suffocated with smoke and scorched by flames.

Even the most timid person, who would shrink in terror at climbing down the regulation fire escape, will easily take to this new device.

A building on fire can be emptied with this apparatus at the rate of 150 persons per minute.

POLITICS

In Place of Principle Guides Oregon Educational Affairs Too Much.

The Western Leader is red hot over the election of D. V. S. Reid as president of the Normal school at that city and says:

But no. The Leader charges that J. H. Raley, J. W. Scriber, J. W. Morrow and W. G. Lynn, men of prominence and ability although the three former may be considered, were false to their trust as normal school regents. They were not seeking to promote the best interests of the school. People who are familiar with the facts know this to be true. The regents know it themselves in their inmost hearts. It was a "job" of the kind that politicians love, but infinitely worse than the usual stripe. It was a job against the school system.

The four regents re-elected to the presidency of the normal school, for which there were numerous other applicants, a man who is unsatisfactory to the patrons of the school, almost without exception. The school under his management had been a failure. They gave him full control, almost equal to the absolutism of the Russian czar, and he was responsible for its failure; yet they re-elected him. They re-elected the president, against whom there were numerous wellgrounded complaints, but dismissed the other members of the faculty, who were doing conscientious, satisfactory work.

FROM DETROIT TO SALEM.

A Flume for Wood and Lumber to Be Established.

The Detroit Flume & Transportation company, which was incorporated today is backed by the Detroit Lumbering company, Hoover Brothers, S. V. Hall and Smith and Smith. The company has a capital stock of \$60,000, \$30,000 of which has already been subscribed and this amount will be expended in putting in a flume from Detroit, on the Santiam to Salem. The flume is to follow the shores of that mountain stream to Stayton, from where it will run along the Mill ditch to this city. The flume along the river will cost about \$2,000 a mile and very much less along the Mill race and comparatively nothing if the race itself is used. The main ditch will be about 54 miles long. This enterprise is one that should interest Salem people very much. The entire output of the Santiam would be handled at this end and a large amount of lumber that would be brought to Stayton for shipment, and shingle mills would do business via the ditch. The Salem Light and Traction Company and other Salem consumers could lay down their wood at a much cheaper rate and it would build up a business between Detroit and Salem of no small proportions. The company will build a telephone line along the route of the flume between the two terminal points.

A Protest.

At a meeting of the Ministerial Association at Salem, Or., June 5, 1899, the following minute was unanimously adopted:

Whereas, the announcement has been made public that what is known as the Conductors' Annual Picnic is to be held at the State Fair Grounds, near the city, on Sabbath June 11, which will result in a great desecration of the Sabbath, and cannot be otherwise than exceedingly demoralizing to the community. Therefore we as ministers of the gospel do earnestly protest, and call upon the Christian people of our churches and congregations to protest against such intrusion upon what we regard as vital to the moral welfare of all classes.
