THE CASES OF SENATOR QUAY AND SENATOR CORBETT.

There is considerable comment being made on the probability of Senator Quay being seated on the certificate of the governor of Pennsylvania. How this can be done, in the face of the precedents established in the Mantle and Corbett cases, which were more meritorious than Quay's, it is difficult to understand, unless the senate in the decision of such matters is controlled by no rule save personal preferences and party prejudices. We never believed that the principle laid down in the Mantle, much less the Corbett, case was entitled to a moment's respect. The principle established by them was the denial of representation to such states as failed to elect a senator. Sovereign states must be disciplined and punished like a refractory boy, until they learn to respect and obey the senatorial will. This kind of treatment, it was supposed, would bring the states to terms and compel their representatives to fix up their factual quarrels and elect a senator. What has been the result? Instead of the isolated cases of Mantle and Corbett, occurring at widely different intervals, there are now four states with only half representation in the senate, on account of the failure of their legislatures to elect a senator. Some one has said that you could not indict a whole people. All the more, you cannot punish them and bring them into obedience after the manner of a refractory child. The construction of that clause of the constitution which gave birth to the principle established in the Mantle and Corbett cases was narrow, technical and absurd, from a practical point of view. It was a construction which reached its conclusion from an over-refinement of words, losing sight of the purpose for which the clause was instituted. The framers of the constitution had provided that the states, both small and great, should have two senators, to be elected by their legislatures respectively, and thereby they had provided for their absolute equality. But the query arose, suppose vacancies should happen between the sessions of the legislature?

How was the representation of the states to be provided for during this interval? It would not do for great states, like New York and Virginia, to have only half representation, caused by vacancies happening during the recess of their legislatures, while the little states of Rhode Island and Delaware, more fortunate, enjoy the influence of full



tor, upon a rule of construction that justifies its expediency and wisdom upon the mistaken ground that a recurrence of the evil, because the facts are otherwise, those being now more such failures to elect since the establishment of this rule, and because the rule itself is unjust and in violation of the spirit of this clause of the constitution, which seeks to preserve the equality of the states by a full representation, when a vacancy occurs in a senatorial office.

In the interest of good government, we believe that these decisions ought to be retraced, and their injustice to the states now and in the future be averted. We believe that the certainty of an executive appointment in the event of a failure to elect will have a tendency to lessen their recurrence; and in the meantime if the states will provide some remedy to punish legislative recalcitancy, the liability of their recurrence will be still further lessened, if not wholly abated.

The will of Isaac Wright has been admitted to probate, and Stephen Wright and Joseph Wright appointed executors thereof.


