FOREIGN NEWS

Reported Assassination of Aguinaldo. The Troubles at Foo Chow China. Political Situation at Bluefields Extremely Quiet.

NEW ORLEANS, June 16.—Passengers from Bluefields report that all political affairs in Bluefields are extremely quiet. The gunboat Vixen has taken up a position commanding the bay and town and south of Bluefields river, and has the Nicaraguan custom house and army post at its mercy.

SHANGHAI, June 16.—A dispatch from Foo Chow says: "Anti-foreign troubles have occurred at Chong Ning Fu, Ngan Hwai province. Church and mission burned, but the missionaries escaped to Ning What."

LONDON, June 16.—The missionary society confirms the report of trouble at Kjong King Fu, adding that two native missionaries have been killed.

CHICAGO, June 16.—The Tribune today prints the following: "London, June 16.—An unconfirmed report is circulated here that Aguineldo has met a fate similar to that meted to General Luna two days ago. Details of the assassination are lacking."

LONDON, June 16.—The Italian government, says the correspondent of the Daily Mail, has demanded satisfaction from France for the arbitrary arrest at Nice of the Italian general, Giletta taken into custody there on charge of espionage.

SINGAPORE, June 16.—The cruiser Olympia, with Admiral Dewey on board, sailed from here at daylight this morning. The next stop made by the cruiser will be at Colombo, island of Ceylon.

WASHINGTON, June 16.—General Otis has called confirming the assassination of General Luna, which he regards as bound to have a good effect, as his large following will now undoubtedly be for peace.
