HOP REPORT.

Condition of Crops in All Parts of the World.

The Outlook in Oregon Fine... Not so Good Elsewhere, But a Fair a Crop Expected.

The condition of the hop crop in Oregon is considered as good as can be expected at this time of the year. All who are going to spray their yards are either doing so now or expect to do so immediately.

The yards about Salem are as a rule looking thrifty and there is every reason, with good weather, to look for a bigger yield than last year and the quality will all depend upon the vermin, blight or mildew.

The following notes were gleaned from an experienced hop grower who has just returned from the yards mentioned below.

The Levy yard is in good condition. Hop vines look fine but the stand is not full. W. H. Francis runs this farm, hop yard and all his crops are generally good.

The Ed Croisan yard is also in good condition and is operated by Wm. German and the stand is better than last year and comparatively free from lice.

The Pettyjohn yard is being operated by Al Pettyjohn and the stand is very much better than it was last year and has been well worked.

The Holmes yard is one hundred acres, 60 of which he is working himself and the other 40 a Chinaman has. The Chinaman's yard is in fine condition and no lice.

The best piece of hops in the vicinity of Salem is that operated by a Chinaman on the Wilson place five miles east of town and the stand is perfect and everything considered he will take the cream in the hop business this year.

R. L. Swartz has about 40 acres of hops upon which, three years ago he grew 15 tons, last year he harvested 9000 lbs and his prospect this year looks up, barring all accidents, as if he would get about 12,000.

At Wallerville, the great hop center in New York State, the following from the Reporter will give a fair idea of conditions.

Transactions have been very few during the past week. The sales were made at prices that show that buyers are obliged to bid a little more than formerly to secure what they want.

There is still some apprehension concerning the growing crop and while the vine seems to be doing fairly well and arming out, still there is not that vigor and growth that farmers would like to see. It is doing much better than two weeks ago. The weather has been almost too cool of late for the best results.

ANOTHER REPORT.

Advices from the interior of New York regarding the effect of recent storms upon the growing crop were variable, some indicating that the vine was injured, while others were to the effect that good, healthy growth was stimulated. Whatever the outcome may be it is certain that buyers were quite as indifferent as they have been at any time of late, both in purchases of 1898 crop goods and in contracting for hops of the 1899 crop. Brewers are buying moderately at present, and secure at old prices what stock they may need. Some dealers are still seeking orders for the new crop at 14 to 15c guaranteeing only quality.
