If Mr. McKinley had the wisdom to see it and the force to carry it out, he might now grasp an opportunity which will probably never come to him again. He could make himself a popular idol and arouse such a fire of enthusiastic support among the people that the nomination which he so ardently desires would come to him in spite of any opposition which might come against him.

The present feeling it is not necessary to describe. Any white man with the blood of a true American in his veins can find it by privately looking into his own heart. The warmest feeling is one of indignance and excuse and hope for better things.

That is about the proportion of gold pieces in circulation among the people here. I was told there was more gold received at the banks than ever before. My gold-standard Canadian bills were not accepted anywhere in our country at par, although they are glad to get our money over there.

AT ST. PAUL.  
We saw the new capital building of pure white marble, brought from Vermont in the rough and finished here. The old state house still stands in another part of the city. The trip between the two cities is made for 10 cents on the Inter-urban carlines. Though ten miles apart the city limits meet, and 5 cents is collected in each city. The trip takes half an hour. The cars now in use weigh 14 tons, have two motors, and seat 62 passengers. New cars are being built that have four motors, weigh 20 tons, and will run 60 miles an hour. The line is double track, built in a loop so you can go one way and come back the other. A new line is being built to Stillwater. The Father of Waters flows between the two cities in a yellow turbid stream, resembling tan yard loach.

SEATTLE, Sept. 11.—The steamer City of Seattle arrived here from Alaska Saturday, with \$600,000 in gold. Four hundred and seventy thousand were consigned to the United States assay office by the Bank of British North America. The steamer Cottage City, arrived Saturday in Victoria, from Alaska, bringing \$300,000 in dust or its equivalent, and 250 passengers. Among those who bring large sums are Dick Lowe, a well-known Klondiker, who is credited with \$300,000.
