A STRINGENT FOOD LAW.

Prohibits the Use of Arsenic or Alum All Articles of Diet.

The law enacted by the Missouri leglature, a copy of which was recently sublished in our columns, and which prohibits the manufacture or sale of any article intended for food or to be used in the preparation of food, which con tains alum, arsenic, ammonia, etc. places that state in the lead in the mat er of sanitary legislation.

Laws restricting the use of alum i bread have been in force in England, Germany and France for many years.
