Big Cranberries.
Boschong Review.
We have recently received from J. W. Newland, of Empire City, a sample of cranberries raised on North Slough, Coos county, which may be seen in The Review window. They are the largest we have ever seen. Mr. Newland writes: "C. D. McFarlin has four acres and raised seven hundred bushels of berries this year, and it is considered a very bad year for berries. C. D. has mostly young vines, and had three hundred bushels. We can get one hundred acres more of land that would make good cranberry land, good mild climate and suitable for berries. They grow on sandy, low land, and prevent the frost and cold weather from injuring them. Pickers pick from one to two bushels a day, realizing 75 per bushel. The best pickers we have are girls from 16 to 20 years of age. Anyone wishing any information on cranberry culture write to C. D. McFarlin, Empire City, Coos Co., Oregon."

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PORTLAND LICENSES.

The New City Taxes That Have Gone Into Effect in That City.

Mayor Storey, of Portland, affixed his signature to the amended revenue license ordinance passed by the common council.

The licenses provided for by this ordinance are as follows:

Chiropractors, \$40 a year; card and sign-writers, operating on the streets, stairways, doorways, recesses or porches, \$20 a year; fish peddlers, with wagons or carts, \$40 a year; fortune tellers, astrologers, mediums, clairvoyants, phrenologists and all persons practicing palmistry, clairvoyance, mesmerism, and all persons using any device for the purpose of telling fortunes or spiritualistic readings or sittings, or exhibitions of such character, for hire, \$30 a year; dealers in powder, shot or any kind of arms, \$20 a year; shooting galleries, Chinese ball games, cane racks, throwing and all other games and performances, excepting bowling alleys where balls rings, shot or a missile of any kind are shot or in any way thrown or propelled against any mark, image or obstacle whatever for a fee, or price, is charged \$50 a year; Turkish, Russian, vapor, electric, salt, magnetic or massage, \$12 a year; bathhouses, where more than 25 cents is made, \$20 a year.

Vehicle taxes are provided as follows: Butters and milk wagons, \$30 a year; omnibuses, \$12 a year; hack and wall pushcarts, \$24 a year; each electric street-car, except where the street railway franchise otherwise expressly provides a different rate, \$50 a year.

The only serious objection to the licenses provided by this ordinance anticipated will come from fortune-telling spiritualists. As the tax, however, in no infringement upon the religious liberties of any one, and is only designed to hit those who use religion as a cloak for humbugging the public any fortune teller may be raised by such fortune tellers will receive but little consideration.
