TO DEPOSE HANNA.

Movement on Foot Among Republicans to Rid the Party of Him.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 11.—Already a movement is on foot among influential republicans to rid the party of its present leader, Senator Mark Hanna, before the presidential campaign opens.

An effort is being made to secure united action on the part of a number of men of sufficient prominence in the party to give their word weight with the president; for while these men hesitate openly to denounce Hanna to the president, they have gone so far as to drop occasional hints of his unpopularity.

These men feel that the interests of the party next year demand a new chairman of the republican national committee, and point to the open opposition to Hanna in Ohio.

Hanna's declaration concerning the trusts makes him a burden to the party, which must declare against these monopolies. It is the understanding that the president points to the Ohio victory as a vindication of Hanna, and clings to him as the most capable party leader; but, notwithstanding this, the purpose to depose him is determined, and Hanna himself, if not the president, will be made to understand his continuance behind the national committee would be against the best judgment of the party leaders.
