FAITH HEALING.
Discussed by Rev. Copeland of the Unitarian Church Sunday Night.

He Admits Wonders in Healing by Christian Science But Claims the Same Power For All Occultism.

At the morning service Rev. Copeland gave his audience a foretaste by saying that while a man might be a member of the medical profession and not be spiritually minded, or not even a moral man, to be a divine healer and succeed required a life on a high spiritual plane. Adding humorously that all ministers were divine healers in degree and probably saved as many lives as the medical healers.

In the evening he had a church full and among his hearers were prominent business men, Governor Geer occupying a front seat. There were a number of Christian Scientists present. Altogether the audience was one of unusual intelligence. The percentage of men was quite large.

The choir sang "Teach Me, Oh Lord, the Way of Thy Statutes," and the minister read from the gospel according to St. Mark, the passages describing the healing of the young man possessed of an unclean spirit, the healing of the withered hand on the Sabbath day, and the sending forth of the twelve to preach and heal in his name with signs following.

"The value of a cause could only be judged by its effect." "Once I was blind, but now I see," was the ultimate text. On this profane text Dr. Copeland hinged his discourse on the miraculous cures wrought by Christian Science. Great wonders had been worked in the past twenty years, beginning with spiritism and ending with Christian Science. Certain Catholic priests had performed great miracles of healing and were still performing them. The same power had been employed down all the centuries and two thousand years before Christ.

He cited the case of Mrs. Hastings, of New England, a certain adventist who was resurrected from certain death by prayer and laying on of hands. He told of mental healers all over the land who were healing all manner of diseases without the use of medicines. One of the signs that followed the discipleship of Christ was the healing of all diseases. The Christian Science healers thank God and earnestly desire that their patients do the same and they are healed. They deny disease and affirm health.

These healings were not confined to the teachers of Christian doctrine. But he expressed the belief that the spiritual healing potencies were the same phenomena of occultism that were common to the magicians of Egypt, India and the initiates of Greece and Rome.

A peculiarity of all these healings was that the person healed could not secure permanent benefit unless he gave to others of the same power which had been received. Harmonious vibrations replaced discords and thereby produced health and if kept up we could live forever.

"The love of humanity must be present to carry on the healing work. Without this light reigning supreme within our hearts we could not enjoy the highest health, strength and power. When the 'Christos' reigns supreme, harmony and health result.

All successful healers demonstrate the reality of the Divine. To assure this perfect harmony, selfishness must be eliminated. The idea that man is divine, and by recognizing this relation to the divine, man was made whole and rescued from disease.

The Christian Scientists have within the present age and within this year worked as great wonders as are recorded in the New Testament. Their success in the destruction of selfishness, and replacing discord with harmony, entitled their cause to be regarded as divine.

Rev. Copeland said in conclusion that he could not join this organization because he refused to call any mere human, lord, master or leader. The Bible says call no man master. There is but one Master, and that is God.

Rev. Copeland attacked the Christian Scientists on two grounds only, the personal leadership of Mrs. Eddy, and the charge that Christian Science healers demanded a compensation in money. He classed Christian Science with Buddhism, Spiritualism, and even claimed the same power for pre-historic Americans.

The solo by Miss Wardlaw was particularly sweet and beautiful, and the choir service, under Prof. Parlin, is a feature at this church.

Manager Tarpley Issues a Notice.

PULLING OFF THE LAST OF HIS NOMINEES.

"Republicans will please take notice that the nominees of the Republican city primaries for councilmen have withdrawn, and that there will be no Republican ticket in any of the Salem wards tomorrow. (Signed) Republican City Central Committee."

The following editorial note also appears in the same issue of the Statesman:

"There is only one ticket in the field for the city election of tomorrow. There is, therefore, no use to be excited about it. But we would like to see a good vote, nevertheless."

The political acumen indicated here is to be credited to the gentlemen mentioned as candidates, rather than to any other source.

There was considerable pressure brought to bear upon the individuals who had figured in the primaries of last Monday to enter the contest. But as the campaign developed they realized that "better part of valor" and discreetly declined.

This action of the candidates and committee leaves a clear field for the nominees on the Citizens' Union ticket, and those gentlemen should now be given a substantial vote as a practical endorsement of what has been done, and as a guarantee of what is expected in the future.
