STATE FAIR BOARD.

JOURNAL X-RAYS.

Officers Elected, Including a Brand New Secretary.

The State Fair board met last evening at the State house and held a session a couple of hours in duration.

There were present W. H. Wehrung, president, Hillsboro; J. H. Settlemier, Woodburn; Jasper Wilkins, Corvallis; Geo. L. Rees, Albany; members, and C. D. Gabrielson, secretary. The other member, Geo. Chandler, of Baker City, also arrived on the evening train.

Secretary Gabrielson's report was received and referred to the finance committee. The report shows expenditures of \$14,565.65 and receipts of \$14,739.66, this leaves a shortage of \$825.99, but \$745.00 of this came over from the old board, leaving an actual shortage of \$80.39 contracted by the new board. As an off-set to this there are unpaid subscriptions of Salem business men \$300, two secured notes for race entries \$130, and \$717.50 unpaid race entries.

The election of officers resulted: W. H. Wehrung, president; J. H. Settlemier, vice president; A. Bush, treasurer; M. D. Wisdom, of Portland, secretary.

There was no contest except for the secretaryship, for which there were several candidates. First ballot resulted: Wisdom 2, Park Dewey 1, E. H. Flag 1. On the second ballot Flag's man broke away and went over to Wisdom, electing the latter. C. D. Gabrielson was not a candidate. He has made a very efficient, accommodating, and painstaking officer and has more than earned the small salary attached to the office.

President Wehrung announced his appointment of committees for the ensuing year as follows:

Finance—Wilkins, Settlemier, Rees; publication—Rees, Chandler; speed program—Chandler, Rees; premium list—Settlemier, Chandler; transportation—Wilkins, Settlemier.
