The right is reserved to reject any and all bids or any portion of a bid. A certified check for 10 per cent of the amount of the bid, made payable to the Superintendent, must accompany the same as a guaranty that if awarded a contract, the bidder will enter into a bonded contract for its faithful performance with good and sufficient sureties. Vouchers in payment will be rendered on the 1st of the month following completion of contract, where contracts are continuous vouchers will be rendered at the end of each quarter.

All supplies must be delivered to the building of the O. S. P. Other things being equal articles of Oregon manufacture or production will be given the preference.
