Weather Report.
From the Corvallis Experiment Station THE JOURNAL is in receipt of the following observation on last month's weather, compiled by E. J. Lea, Voluntary Observer:

In general, the weather conditions this December have not departed very far from normal. This month has been considerably warmer than December of last year, the mean temperature, 41.00, degrees being 4 degrees higher, and 1.44 above normal. The maximum and minimum temperatures for December, 1898, were 54 degrees and 18 degrees respectively; for December this year it was 50 degrees and 29 degrees. The difference, however, is largely due to the unusually low temperature last year. Cloudiness and sunshine are about normal. The rainfall, 7.57 inches, is .38 inch above normal. The only heavy rain, 1.17 inches, occurred on the 10th. The number of frosts is about normal, but in some localities they have been very light. Barometric pressure has been above normal during the greater part of the month. Fruit trees are in good condition. Winter wheat is unusually forward for the season.
