MISS THORNE'S ASSAILANTS

One Brakeman Under Arrest and One Has Fled—Not a Case of Blackmail.

The all absorbing topic here is the criminal assault upon the Thorne girl. Yesterday Special Constable Veatch arrested one of the brakemen on the southbound freight at this place. He was charged with enticing Miss Thorne away.

She was assisted on the southbound freight last Sunday evening by the men in charge of the train at Latham and placed in a box car. She was then outraged by three or four men on their way to Roseburg, where she was discovered next day in the car and sent home.

According to all reports she is now in a precarious condition. The citizens here are very much worked up about the affair as the almost universal opinion here is that the train men are guilty. One of the brakemen has fled.

Harry, the man arrested, is now under \$500 bonds for his appearance here next Monday at 9 o'clock for examination before Justice Vaughn. The effort to prosecute the criminals seems to be a mere farce from all that can be learned, as ample time has expired since the outrage occurred in which the people think the guilty parties could have been apprehended. The idea that it is a blackmailing scheme is not believed here by any one. The girl has always borne a good name here and is not quite 16 years of age.

Coast Rate Hearing.

SAN FRANCISCO, Jan. 15.—The hearing of the suit brought by the St. Louis brokers against the trans-continental railroads resumed before the interstate commerce commission in this city today. The proceedings here will probably occupy ten days. Rebuttal testimony will be taken in Washington where the arguments will also be heard.
