Subscribers Are Not Compelled to Pay Lroubles. for Papers Not Ordered.

The Oregon session laws of 1889 have a law exemping persons from being bilked by designing newspaper publishers. It protects the subscriber from having a paper forced upon him longer than he is willing to pay for it, and prevents running up a bill against unsuspecting persons. It is as follows:

Section 1. That whenever any pern, company or corporation owning or son, company or corporation owning or controlling any newspaper or periodical of any kind, or whenever any editor or proprietor of any such newspaper or periodical, shall mail or send any such newspaper or periodical to any such person or persons in person or persons in state without first receiving an order for said newspaper or periodian order for said newspaper or periodical from such person or persons to whom said newspaper or periodical is mailed or sent, shall be deemed a gift, and no debt or obligation shall accrue against such person or persons, whether said newspaper or periodical is received by the person or persons to whom it is by the person or persons to whom it is sent or not. 
