VISITED BOOMLAND

O. P. Dabney Returns From Three
Weeks Trip.

Visited Seattle, Spokane, Baker City
and Sumpter—Is Still Satisfied
With Salem.

O. P. Dabney returned Monday night
from a three weeks' trip to the Sound
Spokane, and the Baker City country.
He went partly for his health and partly
to see what there was in the boom of
which we are hearing so much. He had
a very pleasant trip and a profitable one
on both counts. He feels better and
has gained several pounds in weight,
and he has satisfied himself that Salem
is good enough for him.

While business is good at the points
above named, it is being overdone.
Rents are very high and still rising.
Both for business and residence prop-
erty. Houses which would rent here
for \$10 a month there bring \$25 to \$40.
Many business locations can only be
rented from month to month, and nearly
every month there is a raise.

Many people are going, looking for
work and for business locations. Many
of the former are disappointed, as well
as the latter.

There is a good deal of building going
on in Seattle, especially residences,
many people from Alaska settling there
to make their homes.

Mr. Dabney saw but one vacant building
in Seattle, and the same in Spokane.
In Spokane three or four fine busi-
ness blocks are going up. There is a
great mining country tributary to that
city and its growth is on a solid founda-
tion.

The indications are that Jim Hill will
expand one to two millions in improve-
ments there this year.

At Baker City and Sumpter the boom
is built to a great extent on expectations.
There are some good solid paying
mines there, and many others that give
every indication of excellence but have
not been developed enough for a cer-
tainty.

Mr. Dabney did not see enough to
justify the boom which seems to be pre-
valing. He thinks it is being over-
done.

The winter at Spokane and Baker
City has been very mild, and there is
not much snow in the mountains.

At Spokane Mr. Dabney saw several
former Salemites. Frank Conover is
there, working for Shaw & Borden.

Judge Garrison is in the insurance
business. Geo. Stevens the fruit dryer
man, is there and the Harbills are con-
tracting and building. Chas. Hellen-
brand is doing well in the cigar business.
J. W. Hendricks and Bud Hamilton
are also there.

After looking over all these booming
towns and cities Mr. Dabney is still sat-
isfied with Salem, and says he has no
notion of leaving here.
