WALLACE, Ida., Jan. 26.—A fire at Gem this morning destroyed the restaurant adjoining the post office. The two-year-old son of A. Magnuson, proprietor of the restaurant, was burned to death. Two cases of small pox appeared in the hospital here yesterday and three varioloid taken at Frisco.

LONDON, Jan. 25.—The Hong Kong correspondent of the Times says: The pirates, emboldened by recent successes, have been again attempting to blackmail foreign firms at Canton. They have demanded 10,000 taels from the China Merchants' Steamship Company, and 50,000 taels from Reuter, Broekelman & Co. and Deacon & Co., under a threat to blow up their offices with dynamite.

"The Chinese authorities are consulting with the foreign consuls. The German gunboat Itis was telegraphed for, and is now anchored off Shanghai."
