TAXPAYERS' MEETING.
A Levy of 6 1-2 Mills Made for This
District.

The Proposed Tenth Grade Was Voted
Down After
Debate.

At the city council chamber last evening
occurred the annual taxpayers'
meeting of School District No. 24, Chair-
man H. T. Bruce presided and Clerk
Jos. Baumgartner read the call for the
meeting.

The first business in order was the
reading of the annual report of the
board of directors, which was published
in THE JOURNAL Jan. 22. Fully one
hundred representative citizens were
present and participated in the delibera-
tions.

After the report was read, Tilmon
Ford asked if it was necessary to estab-
lish a tenth grade.

Judge R. P. Boise then suggested that
instead of establishing a tenth grade
the graduates of the ninth grade be en-
couraged to attend Willamette univer-
sity.

Dr. W. H. Byrd moved to strike from
the report of the board the recommendation
for a tenth grade.

An amendment to the motion was
offered to refer this subject to a com-
mittee of three to investigate and report
upon the subject at the annual meeting
in March, which was lost.

Dr. Byrd made a strong speech against
the tenth grade. He was followed by
Dr. W. A. Cusick in a like speech. Mr.
Ford spoke flatly against the adoption of
the grade and in fact against public
education above the lower grades.

Director Chamberlain stated in an-
swer to a question that the proposed
tenth grade would not require the fin-
ishing off of another room in one of
the buildings, and would only necessitate
the employment of one additional
teacher, costing on the whole not over
\$500.

Prof. Crawford, principal of the Lin-
coln school, spoke of the experience at
Albany. It was to the effect that the
addition of higher grades to the public
schools increased the attendance of the
college.

The motion to strike the recommenda-
tion for a tenth grade from the report carried
and the measure was defeated.

The matter of putting a new heating
plant in the East school was brought up,
and as no one seemed to have any very
definite ideas on the subject the whole
matter was left to the board.

The next question was upon the tax
levy for the coming year upon motion
a mill levy for school purposes was made.

An additional levy of one-half a mill
for repairs was moved by A. N. Gilbert.
Carried.

Adjourned.

SOME HARD QUESTIONS ASKED
How Can One County Be Run Cheaper
Than Another, and Fare Better?

SALEM, Or., Jan. 29, 1900.
EDITOR JOURNAL:—Would it not be
proper for the tax payers and voters in
Marion county to have some explana-
tions from the Republican Clubs which
are now soliciting votes for the June
election and whose members are thor-
oughly organized in Marion county and
the party which has always had charge
of public affairs from the beginning to
the present time of Marion county,
why the tax levy for 1899 in Marion
county is 23 mills and in Linn county
is only 14 1/2 mills? This is a differ-
ence of over 8 mills in the levy for county
purposes. Also why Marion county has
about \$75,000 in county warrants un-
paid, bearing 6 per cent interest, and
Linn county has no warrants unpaid,
and money enough in the treasury to
pay all obligations until about the last
of May 1900? That Linn county has
built and completed a new court house
during 1899 costing over \$25,000 which
is fully paid? That Linn county has
many more bridges to build and equal
expenses in every department to Mar-
ion? That the assessment of property
in Marion county is greater than in Linn,
and would produce a much larger sum
of money if the levies were equal?

We hope the Club will give more ex-
planation of this, to the tax payers and
voters before the coming June election,
as it is unfair to charge the Populist-
Democratic Administration in Linn
county with incompetency, at the pres-
ent time and under those circumstances,
to manage the affairs of the people.
