OREGONIAN ON BRYAN.

Should Bryan be the Democratic candidate the populists of Oregon will certainly stay with him and vote for him. This cannot be said of any other man who could receive the Democratic nomination. Bryan occupies a unique position. He can get the Democratic vote and the Populist vote of the West and South, and no other man can. The difficulty of the situation for the Republicans lies in the apparent probability that many of the multitude of Democrats who voted for McKinley in 1896 may vote for Bryan this year. The causes are numerous and somewhat complex. They lie partly in the events of the time and partly in the general estimate of the character of McKinley and of his administration. But there is no man who can unite the Democrats and populists of this state and of the West as Bryan can, and it may prove as hard a task to keep him from carrying Oregon as it was four years ago.—Oregonian.

OUR NEW POSSESSIONS.

The Oregonian seems to be weakening in its intensity, and has the following mild words concerning the Philippine question:
And if they are to have their own way about the tariff, they may as well succeed. We have little business in the Philippines any longer now, unless it is to be a paying investment. The question is as to whether we should retreat under fire has been settled in the negative. The question what shall we do now is not one of national honor, but of expediency. Whether we should stay in the islands depends on what we are going to do with them. The Truth About the Auction Ordinance. The law makers of our city have under advertisement a new ordinance to regulate auction sales in the city of Salem. Please allow me space in your paper to make a few remarks:

Two hundred dollars or \$200 a year is a very high license and any one paying this high license would have to be continually employed to make anything at all. He could therefore induce those having stocks for sale to bring them to Salem to dispose of.

The present ordinance is a very fair one and hard to improve upon. If it has to be altered I would suggest the new ordinance be made \$150 per year payable in advance to be levied for not less than a year, only one name to appear on the license, and only that one person allowed to talk on it. License non-transferable.

A separate ordinance regulating the sale by auction of imported stock seems to be required.

Tax the stock, and not the home auctioneer.
