SALEM SCHOOL DISTRICT.

FACTS FROM OFFICIAL FINANCIAL STATE-MENT--WHAT OTHER TOWNS ARE DOING

Direct Nomination Ballot for School Director is Asked From All Who Pay Taxes or Have Children to Educate,

There is a \$100 property qualification required to vote at the school election in this district (which is neither just nor constitutional,) but until it is repealed it must be obeyed. But all citezens, male or female, who have children to school or pay taxes to support schools have a right to express their opinion as to public school policies and in the choice of a school director. To this end we invite A Man Thanks the Recorder for Sending all to fill out a Direct Nomination ballot for school director at the end of this
