SENDING OREGON MONEY EAST FOR INTEREST WHILE THE PEOPLE'S SURPLUS LIES IDLE

The board of water commissioners of the Dalles has been advertising for bids for \$25,000 of water bonds. The bids were opened Monday night and the Times Mountain says:

The commission then proceeded to open the bids and accepted that of N. W. Harris & Co., of Chicago, submitted by their agent, H. C. Barrel, of Spokane, which was to take the bonds at par, the commission to pay the expenses of negotiating the loan. The bonds are to run 20 years at 4 per cent. interest payable semi-annually. The loan is considered a good one by the commission, as it is two per cent lower than the present bonds are drawing, and was negotiated on the best terms possible.

The Dalles would have done well to have taken a least from the experience of Salem. Although she pays the same rate of interest, the bargain she has made is not otherwise comparable with the one made by Salem in her popular loan.

The Dalles bonds run for 20 years, while Salem has the option of paying sooner if preferred. The Dalles pays "the expense of negotiating the loan"; Salem paid nothing on that score.

But the greatest difference lies in the fact that The Dalles bonds go to the East and every cent of interest, amounting in all to 80 per cent of the amount received will be sent to the east, while local capital is left lying idle in the banks with no profitable investment in sight. While Salem borrowed her money of her own small capitalists; furnished a good investment for \$50,000 of the idle funds of her own citizens; and not a cent of cold cash will go out of this community for interest.

The Dalles brings in \$25,000 of Eastern money in competition with her local capital, and will send back \$45,000 to pay it up; Salem neither brings in nor sends out a cent.

Some more Oregon cities better get haysed councils, like Salem.

POLITICAL FRUIT GROWERS

THE JOURNAL is asked to borrow a big fruit growers' convention at Portland to form an organization to market their product. This is a very laudable enterprise, but the circular is sent out from a federal officeholder's office at Oregon City and is signed mostly by politicians who are making their living not out of fruit but out of politics.

There is more cause for a wheat growers' convention to form an organization to ascertain why they cannot market their product without "a nigger in the woodpile" of from between seven to twelve cents a bushel between the valley and Portland not accounted for.

When these political fruit growers have organized, what interest will they represent? The producer or the big banking, transportation and commission trusts? Will they not get the fruit growing business into the same deplorable condition that the grain producer is in, when from 7 to 12 cents a bushel is sized "in transit" by the invisible hand of a grasping rubber trust?

Let the producers of wheat and fruit face these facts and then realize that their organization after it is found is

Let England win a few more battles over the patriots of the South Africa republic and see how the sentiment of the world will drift toward interference, how rapidly sympathy will develop for the struggling Republics. Mark this prophecy: the democratic spirit of this age will never permit Great Britain to take possession of those Republics and thereby of all Africa.

If you don't say it the world can only conclude that our country, with Germany, France and Russia, are under secret restraint to permit England to throttle free institutions in the interest of heavily multi-millionaires.

Salem some time ago borrowed \$65,000 from Salem people, through a popular loan, at 4 per cent interest. The plan proved so successful that it has excited interest in all parts of the country. Now the Salem school district proposes to borrow \$10,000 in a similar way. The district at present is in debt to the amount, on which it is paying to Eastern money lenders 9 per cent interest per annum.
