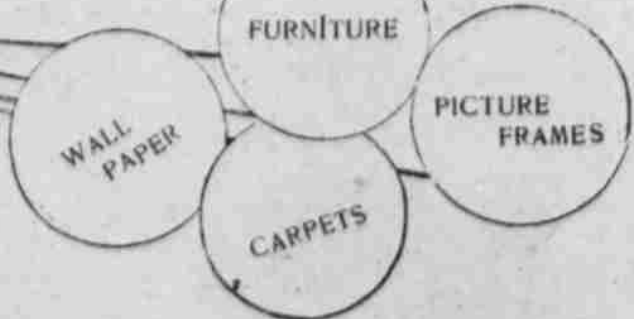
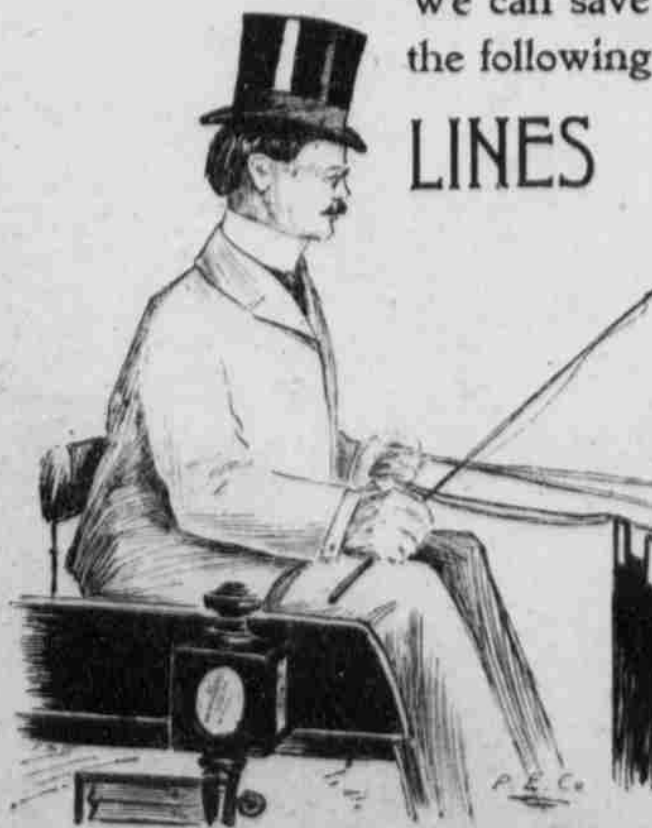

BOER WAR STILL PROCEEDING

More British Troops Headed For the Free State

GENERAL BRABANT FIGHTS ANOTHER SMART ENGAGEMENT

The Awful Scenes on the Line of March From Ladysmith to Colenso

Cecil Rhodes Satisfied That Annexation Will Bring No Lasting Peace to South Africa

In Free State. By Associated Press to the Journal. LONDON, March 6.—The Boers in northern Cape Colony are in full retreat to the Orange Free State.

Brabant a Fighter. DORNBURGH, March 6.—General Brabant has again engaged the Boers today with advantage.

Scenes Leaving Ladysmith. LONDON, March 6.—White's garrison has begun to leave Ladysmith and is arriving Mool river camp where the troops will remain for several days.

In the Free State. A dispatch from Ofontein says that according to Boer prisoners an important British success will cause President Steyn to flee to Pretoria, leaving a provisional government at Bloemfontein.

Annexation No Remedy. LONDON, March 6.—The Morning Leader says: Cecil Rhodes has made up his mind that annexation of the republics will not bring a lasting peace.
