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ship Mr. Scott is elected, after a hard fight, will Mr. Scott as county judge be in a position to protect the taxpayers against Mr. Bingham's grafts in the future? Will Mr. Scott order suits to protect Marion county against Mr. Bingham through his attorney, Mr. Wrightman, who is Mr. Scott's party chairman? We do not say these things to be technical or flippant, but to get at the facts, because all know that Mr. Bingham's bills against the county are larger than the county judge's compensation, and that Mr. Bingham always works the court to a finish if permitted.

It may be that Mr. Scott is a man who can free himself from the political pull of such parties as Wrightman and Bingham. It may be that they have no political axes to grind, or if they had Scott would not let them grind them. We say these things to get at the facts, and if Mr. Scott can convince the people of that fact there is no objection to him on that score. Because, unless the machine graft can be stopped there is not much hope for Marion county taxpayers. Take County Judge Terrell and his record for three years. He spent the first year \$80,170; second year \$71,434; third year \$51,046. The Journal's warfare on jobs broke the political graft and the last year the county was run for something near what it should be run for. The reduction of salaries by the legislature and the economy of the county clerk and sheriff were also responsible for the reduction.

If Mr. Scott is elected we want him to be as free from the influence of push politics as possible. We shall make these matters plain and the people will demand that this county be not run in the interest of party but for business. The question is can he protect the people against the predatory element in the Republican party? The party managers will tell the people he can. But that will not satisfy them. Two years ago the union party pledged a reduction in the salaries and fees of \$9000. The Republicans pledged a reduction of \$10,000 a year and went in on the wave of war excitement. Some reductions were made, but the taxes are higher than ever. Here is the tax rate for the past three years in Marion county:

This is aside from local, school and city taxes.

THE PUERTO RICAN TARIFF.
The Puerto Rican tariff question is purely one of expediency, good faith, and simple common sense. Some of the Republicans seem to have labored under the impression that it was necessary to impose a duty on Puerto Rican products in order to show that we could do so if we desired. They feared the spread of the doctrine that free trade necessarily follows the flag, and that the Constitution in that regard is self-acting and obligatory. A sufficient answer would seem to be that we have now on trade between the island and our mainland. To charge one-seventh of the McKinley rate for two years longer would do nothing more to establish the principle. In other words, the constitutional question as it may hereafter relate to the treatment of the Philippine Islands will not be embarrassed through doing with Puerto Rico the thing that is expedient. This sound and statesmanlike position was immediately taken by Senator Davis, of Minnesota, when the bill came before the senate. He introduced an amendment extending our system to Puerto Rico in a manner virtually analogous to the treatment accorded Hawaii.

Whatever else may be said, it is excessively bad politics for the Republicans. Certain protected interests are strongly opposed to Puerto Rican free trade, but they can hardly be pleased with the outcome in the house. They ought to have saved their ammunition for a real occasion. What they have succeeded in doing has been to put the Republican party in a somewhat ridiculous position, all for the sake of being able to impose a tariff tax only one-seventh as much as the ordinary tax on other imports, and this for a scanty two years. The common sense way to look at it was that in annexing Puerto Rico we had simply added a few square miles more to the tobacco lands of Connecticut and Virginia, and something more to the fruit lands of Florida and Southern California. It is as if another county or two had taken to raising oranges, or the sugar belt on our Gulf coast had been widened a few miles. If we must raise tariff barriers, let them be against outside and not against our own; and let the Puerto Rico in all decency belong on our side of the line.—From "The Progress of the World," in the American Monthly Review of Reviews for April.

CIRCUIT COURT.

An Important Decision by Judge Boise.
—W. R. Smith Again.

Judge Boise has handed down his decision in the mandamus suit in which Helen Williams was plaintiff and the state land board defendant, which was tried in Dept. No. 2 of the circuit court a short time ago.

Briefly the findings of fact are: that B. F. Hutchinson, bought certain land of the state of Oregon and paid for it in three payments, as follows:
August 30, 1873, \$100 00
April 23, 1883, 12 46
December 17, 1888, 207 64

Total, \$320 00
That the state had no title to the land and it was afterward patented by the United States to other persons.

That the state then returned Hutchinson's money in two payments.
April 20, 1893, \$130 00
February 11, 1896, 200 00
Application was made by Helen Williams, sole heir of B. F. Hutchinson, for the payment of interest on this money at 5 per cent. for the time the state had the use of it, but the state land board refused to audit and allow the same for the reason that the act under which said claim was made, to-wit, section 18, of the act approved February 18, 1890, does not authorize the payment of interest on such claims.

The decree is in accordance with the following findings of law:
"First—That the defendants who constitute the said State Land Board are not authorized by the laws of this state to audit and pay the claim for interest on the money of the plaintiff herein.
"Second—That the writ of mandamus issued in this case is dismissed.
"Third—That the defendant, said board, recover of the plaintiff costs and disbursements.

The notorious W. R. Smith, of silverton, was in court again Friday with a petition to take out of the hands of his recently divorced wife the custody of four minor children.

The petition was opposed by the mother of the children and was dismissed.

Frank C. Baker vs. S. W. Bard, et al., sheriff's deed; order granted.
