EDITORIAL.

The present plan is to have 200,000 sheep admitted to range on the treeless portion of the Cascade Forest reserve, at such terms as the Department of the Interior deems fair to the stockmen. This is a kind of a loose arrangement that gives Binger Hermann a great deal of discretion which he will doubtless use wisely for Uncle Sam and Binger.

No one envies Admiral Dewey the good time he is having. For over twenty years he served the government at sea, and was deprived of the comforts of society and family life. He hastened on his retirement to marry a cultured American widow and is taking his ease. George Dewey is all right, if he has made some little mistakes since landing. He made no mistakes when before Manila for two years, in the most trying position an American naval officer was ever placed in. That is a record few can equal.

The crown prince of Germany came of age Sunday and the event was celebrated at Berlin by Emperor, princes, potentates and ambassadors, not missing in the assemblage of highnesses being the American minister. He made a speech and toasted the prince, an unseasonable occupation for a representative of an anti-monarchistic government. It is significant that on the same day there was shipped a magnificent statue of Thomas Jefferson, intended for Louisville. The American artist, Moses Ezekiel, is the sculptor.

It is a little to gamble that in the long run Thomas Jefferson will "do up" all the princes on earth.

Throwing out a few corruptionists like Quay, Clarke and others notorious bootleggers, will go far to make the United States senate respectable. It is a question whether the senate cannot purify itself some more to advantage. But unless the people can get direct nomination, it is only rarely that a senator will be elected without the use of money.

The woodworker and the wood-chopper are the poorest paid laborers. It is heavy work, expensive work, and wears on teams and men. The chances of a wood-hauler making wages are very slim at best. A corporation was formed at Salem to bring wood in by rail, and thus cut down the chances of the wood-cutter to the lowest notch by bringing in the surplus product of cheaper labor.

The state should be the last to enforce unjust competition. In fact, the city, county, school district, and state should be the last to force down price, or to compel labor to take less than a living wage. Public administration should uphold prices of labor. The forces of private competition are too strong.

Young Mr. Hart, of Polk county, evidently considers himself amply quali-

fied to be the public prosecutor of this, the second largest district in the state. He has been a member of a law firm that has had a little business in the courts, but not even the firm was noted for having any criminal cases, and certainly Hart never had any. He should be sent to the penitentiary for flagrant exposure of imbecility.

The Oregonian has committed a breach no progressive newspaper should be guilty of—in printing one of John P. Robertson's belated arguments for fiat money, and then solemnly and editorially replying thereto. Fiat money is not an issue. The country decided for a coin basis of gold and silver in Thomas H. Benton's time and has kept deciding that way ever since. Of course, the government can use the fiat as a last resort, and has done so once or twice.

The biggest local political issue is whether Mr. Minto shall be constable of the ten Salem precincts. He secured fees out of too many last month at the rate of \$1400 a year. There is a general belief that Constable Minto has shown a disposition to work the office for the fees that are in it, but as he is the regular Republican nominee and his defeat would be a death blow to expansion, it is the duty of loyal partisans to endorse Mr. Minto's graft.

It is generally regretted that Prof. Kraps did not let his name stand for county superintendent, the more so since he tells the people that he believes the county school administration should be taken out of politics. To make the county school system the sideshow to serve the purposes of a political faction destroys all enthusiasm among the people, drives the best educators out of the county, or out of the profession, and degrades the schools. Some man like Prof. Kraps is needed at the head of our county schools.

New York Life has this: The recent action of several Presbyteries in New York State and elsewhere, in voting by large majorities to recommend the General Assembly to revise the Presbyterian doctrinal standard, was virtually a protest against the retention of such obsolete articles of faith as a theory of predestination. The idea that some persons are predestinated to salvation or eternal misery, and that neither can avoid their fate, is, nowadays, either ignored or disclaimed by four-fifths of the Presbyterians, and very faintly defended by the rest. It ought to be thrown out. The crowds of all churches are necessarily behind the times, because creeds are conservative, and don't change until their defects have become generally obvious. But even standards of religion ought not to be allowed to get so far behind the times as to become ridiculous. The Presbyterian Church is a body of great respectability and influence. It cannot afford, in justice to its own intelligence, to compel its members to subscribe to dogmas which neither they nor intelligent persons any longer regard as either reasonable or useful.

The same paper touches the supreme heights of sarcasm in this: Meanwhile, as spring advances, Anglo-Saxon civilization is not much more than holding its own. The Philippines are still a source of worry, with few indications, and seem as much like a gold brick as ever, albeit our labors there go

forward with energy and large expenditures of money, and of good work by good men. The most comfort there is for us in our consideration of the Philippines is that after all the British got into a worse scrape than we did, and with less excuse. The longer the job of thrashing the Boers holds out, the fuller is the appreciation of its vast difficulties, and the graver are the doubts of Christendom as to whether, after all, the Boers needed to be thrashed.
