THE SELECTION OF TEACHERS

The Salem school board is to meet tonight for the purpose of selecting principals and teachers and janitors for the ensuing school year. The board is composed of five members and has been constituted a majority. It has been published that a majority of the board have in caucus decided on some removals and the alarming statement was made that sweeping changes were to be made in some of the schools. This has naturally caused some excitement and needless alarm. The school board has held no meeting and reached no decision. Under the present law the best teacher is no protection against removal if the board sees fit to exercise its authority. Under the pressure of personal friends of new applicants good teachers are often—but not so often as formerly—removed. The practice has been at Salem to not disturb a good teacher who was giving satisfaction to the parents and children and working harmoniously with the rest of the teaching force.

The Journal has made a plea each year for as few changes as possible and again renews that demand in the interest of the people. A tenure of office law should be enacted that would give graded schools the benefit of continuity of service, and the best grade teachers, who are competent, might be required to take a class right through the different grades. That is done in the best schools of the country, and may be introduced at Salem. The people are entitled to the service of the best possible teachers for the money, without regard to any personal or political consideration entering into the matter of selection. A member of a school board is acting for the whole community, not for himself or for any party.

THE ASYLUM WOOD BIDS

The state asylum board has decided not to disturb the wood bidders. They have not held the protest of the other bidders to be valid against the bid of one Clark to furnish 3,000 cords at \$2.74, nor the facts recited by the wood-haulers to be of any weight in the matter. The board holds that the law requires them to advertise for bids, and to award the contracts to the lowest bidder. One of the board at least expressed himself to the effect that it worked a hardship on some of the local wood-haulers to give one man so large a contract, but that there was no way out of it. He said the woodmen on their own showing had formed a combination to get \$3 a cord, but had been defeated in forming a trust by a larger combine. The state had to get the benefit of the lowest price regardless of persons.

PROTECT THE ROADS

As the people get better roads and cycle paths built there is growing a demand to have stock shut out of running on the highways. A number of farmers have called on the editor of this paper and asked him to advocate protecting the roads against stock running at large. Of course, the farmer who can do so shut his stock out of the roads in his own interest. Stock that is kept on what is pasture does better and is more profitable than that running all over the country.

HON. CHAS. W. FULTON IN LANE

Reports of His Meeting at Eugene From the Opposition Papers.

A CRUEL FROST

Republican Campaign Starts Off Rather Timely.

NOT OVER 150 PRESENT.

For the past two weeks it has been advertised freely that Hon. C. W. Fulton, of Astoria, would open the Republican campaign at the court house in this city last evening. During the day posters were scattered over the city and some of the leaders were out asking "How?" "Jim?" "Tom?" etc., to be sure and be out. All the candidates for office had also been summoned from near and far to help swell the mighty crowd.

At about 8:30, Dr. Knykendall, the Boss of the G. O. P. in Lane county, arose and after stroking his beard and grinning, made quite a talk, among other things predicting victory in Lane county and the election of McKinley. This was lightly applauded by the "large" audience present of not over 150 persons, consisting principally of office-holders, United States and county, and their deputies, county candidates, a sprinkling of ladies, several boys (who were present to escape the cruel frost), and probably fifteen or twenty private citizens.

Charles W. Fulton then arose and coldly proceeded to deliver the opening speech to the frost like crowd assembled. He was strongly in favor of a gold standard (notwithstanding having delivered hundreds of speeches in favor of gold and silver), was in favor of taxing the poor people of Porto Rico 15 per cent, and was an expansionist. In fact he was in favor of everything and anything done by the McKinley administration. He said it was a long toboggan slide from Lincoln to Bryan, but for to say it was a much larger one from the Fulton of 1890 and 1900; nor did he read any editorial from the Oregonian burning him up for his attitude at the Astoria convention two years ago in trying to defeat the gold standard.

After about two hours of this kind of talk, the small crowd adjourned without cheer, and silently departed for their respective homes.

Mr. Fulton, the man who used to draw large audiences when he talked honestly for gold and silver, left on the 3 o'clock train, glad to get out of town before it froze harder.

It is said the legislative candidates in Lane county will all support the McBridge Mitchell-Eaton senatorial combine, if elected.
