## STEAMBOATS TAXED

City Fathers Handle the Subject of Licenses.

Lighting Franchise to Be Considered Next Thursday—Sift Machines to Be Licensed.

The city council met last evening in regular session, Mayor Bishop presiding. All councilmen were present except Messrs. Boren and Barrows.

In the matter of the Anson Lighting franchise the committee asked that the council consider same at an adjourned session Thursday evening. It also asked until next regular meeting to report upon the ordinance taxing telephones and revising general licenses. A substitute, licensing steamboats was offered in lieu of that taxing wharves and docks.

The street committee made a verbal report on construction of a sewer through block 61, estimating cost of same at between \$300 and \$400, and advising construction of same.

Liquor licenses were granted F. P. Talking and T. M. Zosman.

The contract with C. A. Clark for 100 cords of wood was ratified.

The following resolution was offered by councilman Griswold, which was adopted:

Resolved—By the Common Council of the City of Salem, Oregon, on this, Tuesday, May 15, 1900, that whereas the ladies of Salem are about to hold a Rose Show in this city for the express purpose of securing funds to provide for the erection of a public fountain on one of the parks of the City, this council, desiring to manifest its appreciation of the public spirit and generosity of those engaged in the enterprise, does hereby tender to the management of said Rose Show, the use of the Council Chamber in the city hall, free of charge, for and during continuance of said entertainment.

The license of J. P. Rogers for the saloon on State and High streets was ordered transferred to Alex. Corneer, the present proprietor.

The bid of Young & Johnson to build a proscenium arch and stage 20x50 in the city hall armory for \$105 was referred to the committee on public property.

A number of bicyclists petitioned to have bicycles ruled off the sidewalk on the south side of Ferry street between Commercial and Liberty. Referred to committee on licenses.

A petition for a sewer in block 61, was referred to the committee on ordinances.

Fred Eriksen, the contractor of the new Old Fellows hall, appeared and asked to have the use of half the street room abutting that property. Granted.

An ordinance to license nickel-in-the-slot machines, taxing them at \$24 per year was read the first and second time and duly referred.

An ordinance was also introduced licensing vehicles for hire, at following rates per year: cabs, hacks, trucks or drays, for two horses \$10 per year; for one horse, \$7.50; for vehicles such as automobiles, cars, etc., \$15 per year. Read twice and referred.

Mr. Gesner asked for authority to employ legal advice to draw ordinances taxing telegraph and express companies. Granted.

The ordinance to license steamboats at \$50 per year each was read the third time. Passed unanimously.

The ordinance authorizing a waiver for damages on the back of licenses issued by the city was reported adversely. Upon third reading Griswold and Walker voted aye; Allen, Larsen, Gesner and Riggs voted no. Bill lost.

Councilman Griswold called attention of the street committee to a few filthy alleys.

Upon recommendation of Fire Chief Duncan, J. B. McClain was elected hoseman, vice J. R. Churchill, resigned.

## SALEM'S POPULAR LOAN.

Attracting Wide Attention—An Inquiry From Beyond the Mississippi.

The popular loan engineered by the Citizens' administration of Salem, whereby the city refunded its debt at 4 per cent interest placing its bonds among home capitalists in small amounts have been attracting great deal of attention, not only throughout Oregon and this coast, but wherever the facts have become known.

A few days ago Mayor Bishop received a letter from the superintendent of the public schools of Wausau, Wisconsin, asking details in regard to the loan. The letter explains itself and with Mayor Bishop's reply is given below.

Wausau, Wis., May 7, 1900.—DEAR SIR:—Please send me the details of the popular loan you effected a few months ago. I wish to lay it before our Mayor who is contemplating some such method of refunding. Thanking you in advance for such courtesy. I am very truly,

DEAR SIR:—Replying to your favor of the 7th inst., will, in relation to the popular loan floated by the city last summer, our charter afforded authority for the loan at a rate of interest not exceeding 4-1/2 per cent per annum, provided the people, at an election called for that purpose, authorized the issuance of bonds to cover the loan. The warrant of indebtedness of the city.

The election was held and resulted in an affirmative vote of seven to one, and the council at once ordered the issue, restricting the interest at 4 per cent per annum, and making the loan a popular one, in the sense that the government loan issued by Mr. Cleveland's administration was popular; in other words, the loan was made a part of the public subscription books in that behalf, closing them on a fixed date, and instructing him, and the treasurer, to honor first the lowest subscriptions, then those next highest, and so on until the sum of the issue (\$65,000), had been absorbed by the subscriptions. We kept the books open for twenty days, in which time the loan was subscribed three times over.

The bonds issued ranged in denomination from \$50 to \$25000. They were optional, ten-year bonds, interest payable semi-annually at the city treasury. They were exceedingly popular here and many cities in this state will adopt the method we employed as soon as local exigencies demand it.

Thanking you for this expression of your interest, in an affair we are all proud of here, it being the first radical departure from all old methods of finance, on this coast, I beg to remain, Yours very truly,

Murphy for sheriff, is gaining support among all classes of citizens, the several hundred Spanish war veterans, who have seen the brave young soldier tried on many an ensanguined field in far away Luzon, giving him their most cordial support, irrespective of party affiliations.—Salem Statesman.
