At any druggist's get 5 cents worth of tannic acid, add a teaspoonful of water, mix well and then apply on both palms, rubbing your palms together so as to have moisture penetrate the lines, etc., thoroughly. Then place your hand on the paper, holding it there steadily and with pressure for two minutes. Keep your hand firm on the sheet, then raise hand gently.

Only use a small amount of the acid mixture on your palms, just enough to color the palm. Do not have it in streaks on the palm because that will make it blur on the impression sheet.

Directions how to remove the stains from your palms: Wash hands in vinegar thoroughly; then use soap as usual.
