THE GRAND ARMY'S DAY.

The parade was more extensive than usual and was made up as follows, under the direction of Marshal J. Q. Barnes and his three aides:

Chemawa band.
Company F 4th Regt. O. N. G.—Capt. Walter Lyon commanding.
Selgwick Post, No. 10 G. A. R.—H. I. Brown commanding.
Spanish-American War Veterans, George W. Jones, commanding.
Battalion—Chemawa training school. D. E. Brewer commanding.
Citizens in carriages.

Sedgwick Relief Corp. joined the column at the cemetery, the way being too long for the ladies to walk out.

So few Indian War Veterans reported that Capt. Jas. Elgin withdrew with them from the parade.

The Spanish War Veterans made a manly appearance in their khaki uniforms.

The Indian School Cadets, nearly 100 strong, also presented a very creditable array, and the Chemawa band furnished appropriate music.

The usual impressive ceremonies were carried out at the Grand Army plot at the cemetery, and when the sun at night went down behind the western hills it lit with a flood of crimson glory the graves of all the soldier dead, at rest beneath a wilderness of flowers.

After the return to the city, lunch was served to the old veterans, by the ladies of the W. R. C., at the G. A. R. hall in the insurance building. This was highly appreciated after the long tramp.

The fine appearance and perfect order of the two ceremonies was due to the two sections, Barney Simpson and Jeff Bohman and their aides.

The weather could not have been better. It was cool and pleasant, with light clouds, and there was very little dust, usually a disagreeable feature of Decoration day.

Manager Jas. Lambert and his efficient crew of motormen and conductors, handled the crowds that traveled on the street cars with neatness and dispatch.

The stores and business houses of the city were closed during the afternoon.

AT LEE MISSION.

While the main exercises of the day took place at the cemetery south of town, the old soldiers at rest in the Lee Mission cemetery were not forgotten. During the forenoon the Union Veterans' Union and the ladies of the G. A. R. went to Lee Mission in a body and with simple ceremonies decorated with flowers the graves of their old comrades resting there. A goodly number were present, and undoubtedly more would have been there had the meeting been announced in THE JOURNAL; but, unfortunately, those whose duty it was to leave a notice at this office proved recalcitrant to their trust, and this paper was not notified, thus being deprived, much to its regret, of an opportunity to notify its readers in time.

After the ceremonies were over the participants returned to the city, where to the number of over 80 they partook of a bountiful dinner, and in the afternoon and evening they mingled with the other old soldiers at the cemetery and the church.

IN THE EVENING.

The First M. E. Church was crowded to the doors, and many stood up, though the aisles were filled with chairs. The program was carried out as published, and was of a very interesting character and appropriate to the day.

The Chemawa band, the Salem Choral Society, under the skillful direction of Professor Seley, and a male quartet consisting of Messrs. Seley, Belknap, Boschen and Drew, rendered patriotic music, and the soprano solo by Mrs. Jordan Purvine was a genuine treat.

Miss Mabel Carter recited Kipling's "Recessional" and Riley's "The Drum," very effectively. Alfred Wright recited an incident in the war in a creditable manner, and Miss Mand Griawold did exceedingly well with a piece commemorating the gallantry of one-armed Phil Kearney.

The address by Rev. H. A. Barden, of Portland, was an exhaustive review of American history, rising at times to eloquence. He gave all expansionists a chance to applaud, but deprecated imperialism. He also woke the woman suffragists to enthusiasm. The only bitter note in his address was expressive of his disappointment in not seeing Old Glory waving where he first looked for it on arriving in the city—over Willamette University. It has been a long time since the stars and stripes have graced the flagstaff of that institution.

The singing of America by the choir closed the exercises of a day which has been to a greater extent than usual devoted to the appropriate observance of the old soldiers' holiday.
