WASHINGTON, June 4.—The minority report in the Court D'Alene investigation was given out today. The report points out that investigation shows that when the federal troops arrived upon the scene, quiet had been restored and no resistance was being made to the state authorities. The minority says from the evidence adduced before the committee that Merriam was wholly mistaken as to his powers and that his conduct resulted in the gravest injustice to the liberty of individuals. The minority hold that the president was not justified in keeping federal soldiers indefinitely in Shoshone county.
