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DANGER IN ALASKA.

What An Old Sea Captain Says of Voyaging Up There.

Referring to the dangers through which Alaska voyagers, of whom several are Pendletonians, the following is from a well known Alaska captain: Captain Daniels, an old Alaskan navigator, who knows every rock and turn of the conflicting currents and eddies, and who is also interested in the California & Oregon Coast Steamship Company, says there will be plenty of salvage work for tug boats on the Nome route this summer. The route to Nome, he says, is not as dangerous as the trip to Skagway, but the greatest danger will be after reaching Nome beach.

For 60 miles the waste of waves from Bering Sea sweeps Nome beach, affording no protection whatever for anchored vessels. Usually a high surf foams along this stretch. Very rare are the intervals when there is not a line of high breakers beating against the sands. Vessels cannot come within a mile of shore without danger to themselves. Besides having both anchors out, they must be kept under a full head of steam all the time, ready to put to sea at the first sight of a blow. The anchorage holding is poor, and once the waves beat the vessels shoreward there would be no hope of ever getting them off again.

This constant battle with the seas, by which steamers are kept plunging at them, and only the staunchest are able to stand it. The unsteady vessels now headed north, if so fortunate as to get that far, will soon be pounded to pieces by the hammering of the waves. If the weather is good all the time they might be able to weather it, but the first blow will drive them ashore, as they are not strong enough to put to sea in the teeth of even an ordinary Bering sea storm. The first steamer returning will probably report several ship disasters.

The loss of passengers will not likely be heavy, as most of them can be landed safely in surf boats even during a heavy blow. There are no dangerous currents and whirlpools like in the narrows of the inside route to Skagway, where the Clara Nevada and other Klondike craft sank without an instant's warning.
