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## A DEMOCRAT TALKS.

SAYS THE LEGISLATURE WILL ELEGIT MITCHELL

Anti-Machine Republicans Will Control Both Branches of the Oregon Legislature

A prominent Portland Democrat in the city today talked freely of the political situation as the result of the recent elections.

"He said that on the legislative ticket they had smashed orthodoxy and for the first time in history would send up sixteen votes that were against the regular machine on all points of local political importance. He did not pretend to forecast the result as to the organization or

ELECTION OF SENATOR.

"There was no question that the Simon and Corbett fight on Mitchell precipitated all the Mitchell Republicans to the support of the Citizens' Democratic nominees. That line of fighting will be kept up in the organization of both houses and I do not doubt the Reform forces will organize the legislature."

"IT WAS A SURPRISE all around the way the legislature was chosen and unless some agreement is reached it will be a mixed-up of the finest water. I do not think there has been any conference of the opposition members. My own personal opinion is that Mitchell will be elected senator. I do not see how they can very well do otherwise under the circumstances."

I do not see what the Democratic party can gain from Mitchell's election. They helped elect him once and it tended to disorganization and would do so again. It certainly would not help the organization in the future. Of course, the regular Democrats on the delegation will act with the Democratic organization or else we might as well throw all party organization to the winds and merely divide between the Republican factions."

"WHAT THE CITIZENS WILL DO," is not clear except that they are heart and soul for Mitchell. They are in for an organization of the legislature that will enable them to cripple or weaken the regular machine ring that is still in control of the city and county government. They will join the Democrats to gain that end.

"It was not expected that the citizens representative ticket would be elected, although it was pretty certain that the senatorial citizens ticket would win. It is a kind of a surprise all around to have so many members from Multnomah not regular Republicans."

The anti-Simon and anti-Corbett Republicans elected in different parts of the state are just as much opposed to the results of Simon ring rule and legislative work for the past eight years as Democrats, and will help undo that work as much as possible, and will seek to perfect a legislative organization to that end in both branches. But there has been no understanding to that effect. There may be a conference of the opposition forces to agree on a cause of action but I do not know that such a course has been agreed upon. Indeed, I do not profess to know what is being done to unite the forces."

PROGRESSIVE OREGON TOWN.

Marshfield Will Establish Its Own Electric Lighting Plant.

At a meeting of the city council of Marshfield, Coos county, it was decided to purchase an electric plant to be owned and operated by and for the city; also for private lighting. The town has been in darkness since February last, on account of the electric company and the council not being able to come to an agreement as to prices for city lighting. Prior to that date the company was paid \$11 monthly for each arc lamp. At last night's meeting the company made a proposition to furnish 14 arc lamps for \$9.50 per month, if given a contract for five years. The council would not consider giving a contract for that length of time, but did offer one for three years; this was refused; consequently negotiations are pending for the purchase of a plant by the city. The plant to be purchased will cost in the neighborhood of \$10,000, will furnish about double the power of the plant owned by the company, and will have capacity for lighting purposes, both public and private, for years to come. This action by the council gives universal satisfaction.

On Trial in the Police Court for Assault and Battery.

The trial of Andy Raymond, charged by L. Landon with assault and battery, took place before City Recorder Judah this afternoon.

The defendant is one of the troupe of entertainers assisting the Quaker doctors, in their nightly exhibition on State street, and the trouble occurred Saturday night.

It seems that there has been more or less friction between the Quaker aggregation, and the boys of the city. The boys having caused considerable disturbance at the meetings which are carried on by the medicine men, under a license issued by the city, the latter being inclined to take the law into their own hands instead of calling upon the police.

On Saturday night the man Raymond started through the crowd selling medicine, and the story is that he was in the habit of pushing his way roughly with little consideration for ladies or children. He pushed through a crowd of young fellows near the platform, shoving some of them roughly to one side. When he came back the boys had it in for him. He pushed Landon off the side walk and Landon came for him. Raymond again pushed him away and told him to keep off, but Landon returned, and got one in the face.

In the fracas, Fred Kress also went up against it, with the same result. Police Officer Smith was in the crowd but not at the immediate scene of the disturbance.

Landon at once went and swore out a complaint, and Raymond was arrested. He deposited \$25 cash bail and was released until this morning, when he was arraigned and plead "not guilty," the trial being postponed until 2 p. m., to get witnesses.
