NEW ENGINE ARRIVES.

Big Corliss for the S. L. & T. Co's Enlarged Plant.

The new engine and fly wheel for the power house of the Salem Light & Traction Co's power plant has arrived and lie on a flat car near the freight depot.

The engine is a 20x48 Columbian Corliss of 300 horse power. It is so plain and simple in construction that it hardly looks like a full fledged engine, but more like a section of the hind leg of a Brobdignagian grasshopper.

The flywheel is in two sections. It is 18 feet in diameter, with a 32 inch face, 24,400 pounds.

This new engine will be set up in the extension recently erected at the south side of the power house where the cement foundations are already prepared.

It is a work of much nicety to set up and adjust the new machinery, and it will be several weeks before the new engine will be turned over.

Another large dynamo is to be added to the plant and the whole business will be hooked up in such a way that either of the two large engines can be used to run the whole plant, or any part of it, or both may be used at once, so that no minor accident can interrupt the service.

THE JEFFERSON BRIDGE.

Is Dangerous and Slightly in Need of Repairing Says the Review.

If our memory is correct, and we think it is, county Judge J. H. Scott promised some weeks since to at once look after the repairing of the wagon bridge crossing the Santiam at this city, but as yet has not done so. We are of course aware that many demands are made upon Judge Scott's time, and that he cannot comply with all at the same time but this bridge, especially the west approach, is in a dangerous condition, the decking being full of holes, and the entire structure is getting shaky and needs overhauling. There is a heavy travel over it, and further neglect in the way of repairs is more than likely to result in a suit for damages. Nothing is gained by procrastination in a case of this kind and we trust the necessary action will be taken at once.

WHY NOT GIVE EVERYBODY A SUBSIDY?

The profits last year of the Standard Oil company were \$38,000,000. This year they are \$48,000,000, a sum many times as great as the value of all the wheat produced in Oregon in the state's best crop year. The company is anxious to increase its profits. Besides oil stock, it owns ten great banks, and a steamship line. The steamship line is the International Navigation Company and to increase the earnings of this and other ocean lines the Ship-Subsidy scheme has been devised. The bill is pending in congress and it is favored in the Philadelphia platform. It gives an annual bonus of ten to twenty millions of money to the steamship companies.

This great sum is to be paid out of the public treasury each year for the next 20 or 30 years. Concerning the Ship-Subsidy bill the New York World says: "The amendments made to the Ship Subsidy bill improves it as a beneficence to our shipyard owners. It is difficult to see that they make it better for anybody else. They make it, as before, a bill to take millions of money from all the people and give it outright to the ship-builders. There is nothing in it for the farmers, the manufacturers or the industrial classes, those who must pay the bonus—because it does not offer them the smallest reduction in freight rates on the goods they have to export. When then does it propose to benefit except ship-builders, who are already enormously prosperous, and whose absolute law-secured monopoly of our vast coasting trade for vessels of their construction renders their property secure for all time to come? "Why should the people be taxed for these men's additional enrichment?"
