HOP STATISTICS.
Annual Circular of the Pacific Coast Hop Crop.
Compiled by Lillenthal Bros. Agent at Salem for Year Ending July, 1900.
Owing to the pressure of other work Mr. Ottenheimer has been delayed in issuing the annual circular showing the movement of the Pacific coast hop crop for the year ending July 1st, 1900. The harvest of the new crop on the Pacific coast will soon be completed and all indications point to a crop of excellent quality but considerably less in quantity than last year. We do not expect it to exceed 100,000 bales as against 177,300 bales in ninety-nine.

POLITICS AND EDUCATION.
Brother Grannis replies very lamely to the Republican who takes him to task for making himself the head and organ of a political propaganda that seeks to overthrow the Republican party in Oregon, while asking Republican business men to shell out their shekels for the support of Willamette University.
Here is his defense of his position: "I expect to continue my efforts upon that plane as long as I sustain a connection with the cause. I have my opinions about what is best in relation to our government, and have some views as to what side of the great moral questions just now agitating the public mind. President McKinley and all officers of state and nation should take. But what has all this to do with Salem's obligations to Willamette University?"
In other words, Brother Grannis can see no inconsistency in wiping up the earth with McKinley for the sake of what he calls a "moral cause," and at the same time asking McKinley's supporters to come down with their money for a "political cause." Prohibitionists, Populists, Democrats and Socialists no doubt enjoy the "lambasting" Brother Grannis gives the Republicans and say it is all deserved. They enjoy it intensely when they recall that McKinley was supported four years ago from nearly every Methodist pulpit in the land. The Y. M. C. A. held public prayer-meetings for McKinley and sound money. There were Methodist ministers who went so far as to write their names across the backs of their ballots, violating the election law in their zeal for the Republican candidates. Some of these are not so furious for Little Mac and Morality this year and some are as furiously fighting McKinley.
The Republican kick on Brother Grannis and his Prohibition Searchlight is that it is liable to throw several thousand votes against McKinley and make Oregon a very close or doubtful state for the Republicans. No wonder Republicans are in favor of dissolving political partnership with Willamette.
These kicking Republicans could see no impropriety in President Hawley making Republican campaign speeches. He could go up and down the state for them at all times, could convert students into partisans, or even invade the college chapel or the sacred precincts of the Chatauqua with "God, and McKinley" harangues, and they could enjoy it! They can't enjoy Grannis.
While Hawley was doing campaign work for the Republicans, Democrats, and Populists were asked to send their children and pay their money. Of course, they did not enjoy it, but what did the Republican politicians care? The fact is the sooner the trustees get rid of political partisan propaganda like Hawley and Grannis, the sooner can they command general support and respect for the school.
Education, and even Christian education of the right sort, is needed by all families. No man or woman should have his political principles assailed by those who are in charge of the educational concerns of the country. If President Strong or President Gatch of our state colleges took the stump, would the legislature give their schools appropriations? Not readily. No one would expect it. This Grannis incident has served one good purpose, to bring out the incompatibility of education playing at the game of politics.
Neighborhood Disturbed.
Wednesday night near the home of Henry Fletcher 2 1/2 miles from the fair grounds and just out back of his hop house a panther put in the night at keeping the neighbors awake with its hideous cries, scaring the people in the neighborhood out of a year's growth.
