Foreed to Discard 600 Wives.

The Apache, Comanche and Iowa In-
dians who live on the reservation near
Wichita, Kansas, has just gone through
a very trying ordeal and one that was
rather embarrassing. Sometime ago the
government issued a decree that the
"bucks" in the tribe could have but one
wife, and it was ordered that every man
who had more than one squaw must
forthwith give them up. The Indians
protested in vain against what they con-
sidered monstrous treatment, but a short
time ago the Indian agent, Captain Mis-
chener, issued a call for all the Indians
to meet him at Darlington and submit to
an examination. Captain Tullington of
the regular army was present to assist
in the legal separations and many a sad
and pathetic scene was enacted.

Narjo, a great Apache chief who was
the love of all his people, had ten wives,
and he had just finished arrangements
for two more when the government or-
der was issued. On the morning of the
day set for the appearance at Darlington,
Narjo, was one of the first to appear,
and with him came his ten wives. Narjo
was given the opportunity of making a
choice as to which wife he would keep,
and in fact all of the Indians were given
this privilege—and he chose the oldest,
ugliest and fattest one in the bunch.

Two of his discarded wives, young
squaws of rather a pleasing appearance,
forthwith killed themselves.
Tall Elk, a Comanche warrior, had a
nice bunch of nine wives, and when he
was forced to give up all but one, six of
the other eight killed themselves. The
discarded squaws were sent away to the
agency building, where they will be cared
for by the government until their reser-
vation is thrown open for settlement this
winter. Then these squaws will have
money enough paid to them to take care
of themselves. All in all 600 squaws
have been discarded by the Indian war-
riors, but they are not going to want for
husbands, for it is said that the cowboys
are swooping in off of the plains and
gathering them up. The cowboys solve
the servant girl problem by marrying a
squaw.
