WARHINGTON, Jan. 14.-The United tates Supreme Court today rendered a decision in Neely extradition case. The Court theld that Neely was subject to extradition, and must be surrendered Desired to Cuban authorities.

The Court held that Cuba is foreign territory. The decision was based upon act of 1890, which was held to be con stitutional.
